I am submitting this letter on behalf of the Capital Improvement Advisory Committee (CIAC) regarding the Land Use Assumptions (LUA), Water and Wastewater Capital Improvement Plans (CIPs), and proposed impact fees. The CIAC held two meetings at which the LUA map, Water and Wastewater CIPs, and the proposed impact fees were presented by AEI Engineering.

The CIAC supports the LUA map and Water and Wastewater CIPs as presented by AEI. Two methods for calculating the impact fees, which are the revenue credit calculation and the 50 percent credit methods. The CIAC further recommends the maximum assessible impact fees calculated using the 50 percent credit method. This method calculated a maximum assessible Water Impact Fee of \$2,200 and a maximum assessible Wastewater Impact Fee of \$5,200.

RESPONSE #1: The proposed development includes 2 buildings with a mix-use of the land. Building No. 1 design is proposed as a combination of a single dwelling with a commercial retail area; the second building is proposed as a combination of a single dwelling on the second level of a warehouse/office building. The site is in a Semi-Urban Residential zone ("SU"), and within a quarter mile the property is surrounded by undeveloped land, single family dwellings, religious buildings, and commercial use properties. The proposed mix-use buildings will allow an opportunity for housing and employment at lot, similar to other uses of land within a quarter mile vicinity.

QUESTION #2: A list of similar existing uses in the vicinity of the parcel proposed for development:

RESPONSE #2: For the proposed mix-use of the lot, other similar uses of land in vicinity include single residential properties as well as commercial and religious uses of land. On the south side, the property is adjacent to a single dwelling, and will be screened with 8'-0" wide buffer-yard and an 8'-0" high wood fence.

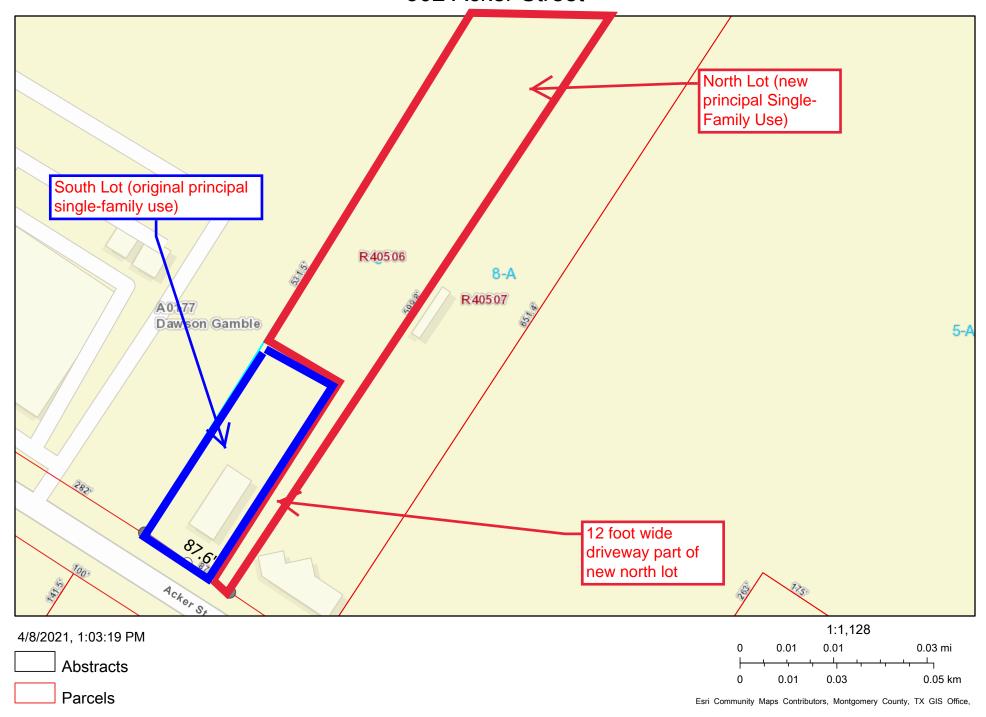

I am proposing to develop the site with two buildings and a Mixed-Use Classification per Article 2-2 Land Uses of the Unified Development Code("UDC"). If approved, my intent is to build a Single-Family Dwelling attached to a Retail Facility in Building 1 and a Single-Family Dwelling unite attached to aWholesale-Office facility in Building 2.

Be advised that per Parking Tables7-1-2.02.2 and 7-1-2.02.3 of the UDC, I am proposing to provide a total of 34 parking spaces, if allowed. of buildings with thefts of contents in safes. Chief Montgomery also noted that the safe crews appeared to be organized and professional in their behavior and ability to commit their crimes.

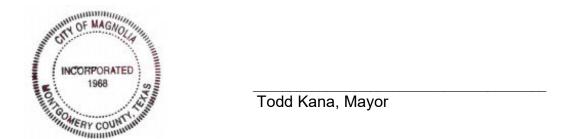
b. ADMINISTRATION / PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT (City Administrator, Don Doering)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS, AMENDING ITS ZONING ORDINANCE, BY APPROVING ZONING CLASSIFICATIONS CHANGE REQUESTS WITHIN THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TEXAS; AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY TO REFLECT THE APPROVED ZONING CLASSIFICATION CHANGES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; MAKING FINDINGS OF FACT; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER RELATED MATTERS.

Whereas, certain property owners have requested that certain tracts listed and identified in the attached Exhibit "A" in the City of Magnolia, Montgomery County, Texas, (the "Properties"), be rezoned; and

Whereas, the property owners have presented applications to the City for the rezoning of the Properties; and

Whereas, at least fifteen (15) days after publication in the official newspaper of the City of the time and place of the public hearings and at least ten (10) days after written notice of that hearing was mailed to the owners of land within two hundred feet of the Property in the manner required by law, the Planning & Zoning Commission held the required public hearings on each of the requested re-zonings; and

Whereas, the Planning & Zoning Commission recommended in its final reports that City Council approve each of the requested re-zonings; and

Section 6. City Council finds and determines that the meeting at which this ordinance is passed was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Texas Open Meetings Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ch. 551.

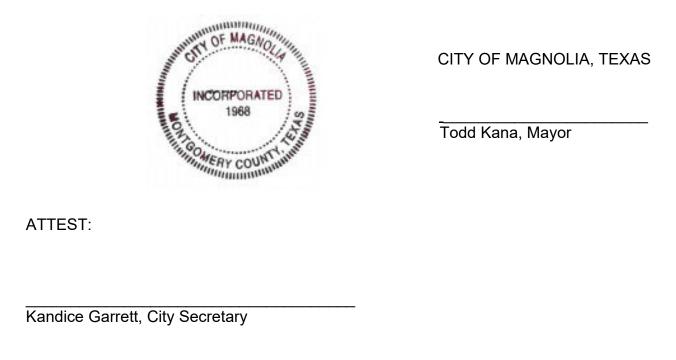


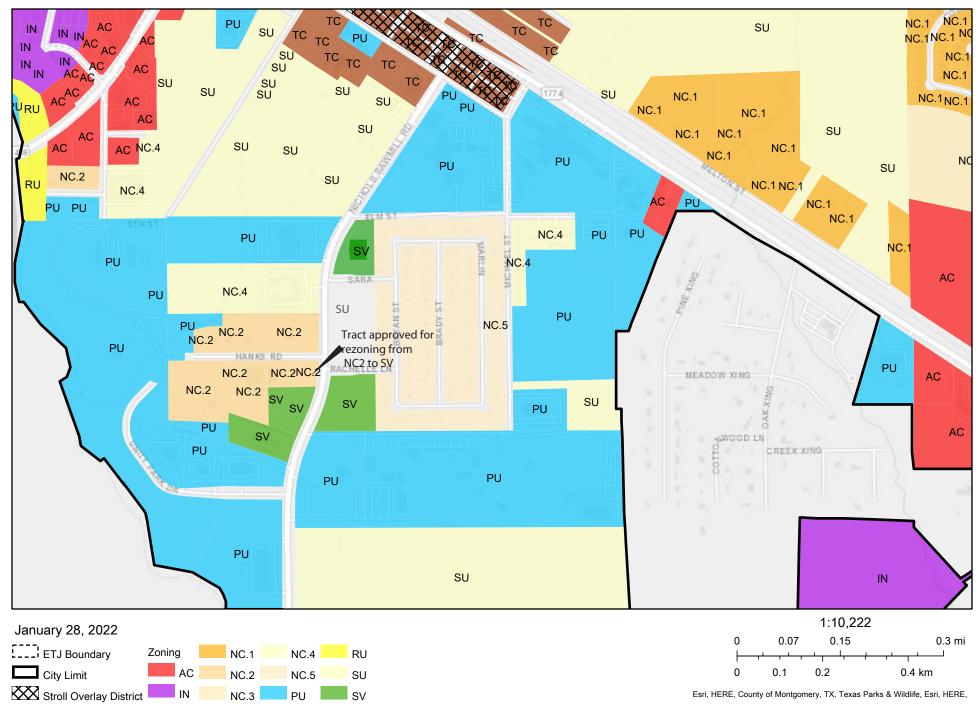

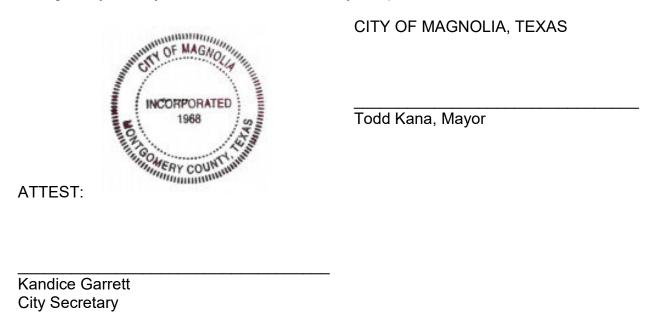
WHEREAS, the City Council hereby finds and determines that all public notification and comment procedures under Texas State Law have been followed pertaining to the proposed amendments to the UDC.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS:

- <u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 6 of the Unified Development Code, Sec. 6-1-4.01 Freestanding Temporary Signs is hereby amended as shown in the attached Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein for all purposes.
- <u>Section 2</u>. Repealing Clause. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed; provided, however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this ordinance shall be cumulative of other ordinances regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this ordinance.
- **Section 3.** Severability. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance be severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences or sections of this ordinance, and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be enforced as written.
- <u>Section 4.</u> Compliance Clause and Effective Date. The City Council finds, determines and declares that a sufficient written notice was posted and this Ordinance was passed in accordance with the Open Meetings Act. The City Secretary is instructed

to publish this Ordinance in the Official Newspaper of the City of Magnolia in the manner provided and for the time required by Section 52.011(a) of the Local Government Code, at which time this Ordinance takes effect.

UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE

Sec. 6-1-3.03 Freestanding Sign Setbacks

A. **Generally.** *Freestanding signs* shall be set back from *property lines* and other uses as provided in this Section.

B. Setback from Property Lines.

- 1. *Front and Side Street Setbacks*. Along *street frontages, signs* shall be set back from street property lines the greater of:
 - a. 10 feet; or
 - b. Two feet for each foot of sign height.
- 2. *Side and Rear Setbacks*. Signs shall be set back from side and *rear lot lines* according to the interior side and rear setback requirements that apply to *principal buildings*.
- 3. *Line of Sight/Safety Requirements*. The *Administrator* or designated appointee shall review the line of sight from a safety perspective to ensure that signs do not obstruct views from travel lanes of *public streets* in a manner that would create an unsafe condition.

C. Additional Setbacks from Uses.

- 1. No permanent freestanding sign shall be constructed:
 - a. Within 200 feet of a public park, or a publically owned *parcel* that contains or could contain a public *building*, or public school facility;
 - b. Within 200 feet of a parcel that contains a private school;
 - c. Within 200 feet of any historical site; or
 - d. Within two times the *height* of the sign from the nearest point of entrance into any area used for residential purposes.
- 2. This requirement may be waived for *development* on existing *lots* if:
 - a. The development cannot comply with the terms of the Subsection because of the existing geometry of the lot;
 - b. The existing building is set back more than 25 feet from the edge of pavement; and
 - c. The setback from the uses listed in Subsection B.1., above is as large as is practicable in order to give effect to other setback requirements of this Section.

Division 6-1-4 Temporary Signs

Sec. 6-1-4.01 Freestanding Temporary Signs

A. **Generally.** There are many forms of *temporary signs*. This Section sets out which forms of temporary signs are allowed by use and the size and *height* standards that apply to them. *Sign*

types that are not listed in **Table 6-1-4.01**, **Permissible** *Freestanding Sign* **Types**, are not permitted as freestanding signs.

- B. **Banners.** *Freestanding Banners* are permitted for use to inform the public of special events. Banners are permitted for use in residential and nonresidential districts provided that:
 - 1. There is only one banner per site, or no more than one banner every 400 feet of frontage, whichever is less:
 - 2. The banner is firmly attached to supports to provide for safety of motorists and pedestrians;
 - 3. The banner complies with the standards of *Section 6-1-2.03 Prohibited Sign Locations* with the exception of fences; a temporary freestanding banner may be placed on a fence, with permission of the fence owner, to ensure line of sight/safety requirements if approved by the Administrator;
 - 4. The area of the banner is no larger than the sign area allowed for a monument sign, *Table 6-1-3.02 Permissible Freestanding Sign Types* for the same site.
 - 5. No banner is displayed for a period of more than 30 days every six months.
- C. Setbacks. All temporary signs shall be set back at least five feet from all property lines. Temporary signs that are not visible from public right-of-ways or abutting property are not restricted by this Section.

 - 1. The sign is located within three feet of the *building* or the outside edge of the sidewalk; and
 - 2. There is at least six feet of clear sidewalk area for pedestrian use;
 - 3. The sign is located in front of the use to which it is associated.

Sec. 6-1-4.02 Attached Temporary Signs

A. **Generally**. Attached *temporary signs* are permitted subject to the standards in this Section.

WHEREAS, City Council, after considering the testimony and comments of the public, reports and recommendations of City Staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission, and the deliberation of its members, by passage and approval of this Ordinance hereby determines the action taken herein is meritorious and beneficial to the public health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. Findings. The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted and made a part hereof for all purposes as findings of fact.

<u>Section 3. Zoning District Reclassification</u>. Conditional Use Permit to allow mixed use in a Semi-Urban Residential District (SU), Zoning District Classification is hereby assigned to the Property described in section two.

<u>Section 4. Zoning Map Revision</u>. The City Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to have city staff revise the Official Zoning Map to reflect the change in Zoning District Classification approved by this Ordinance.

<u>Section 5. Repealer</u>. Other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent of such conflict.

<u>Section 6. Severability</u>. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance be severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences or sections of this ordinance, and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be enforced as written.

Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance is effective upon final passage and approval.

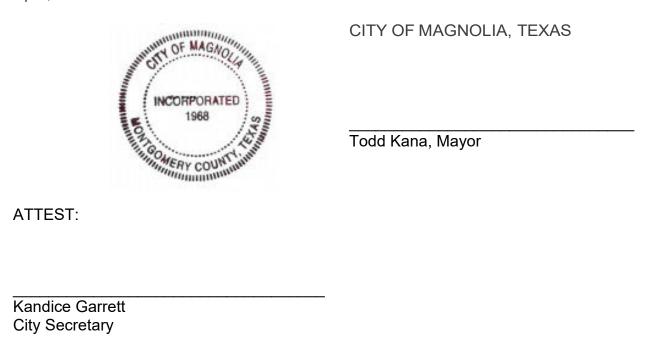
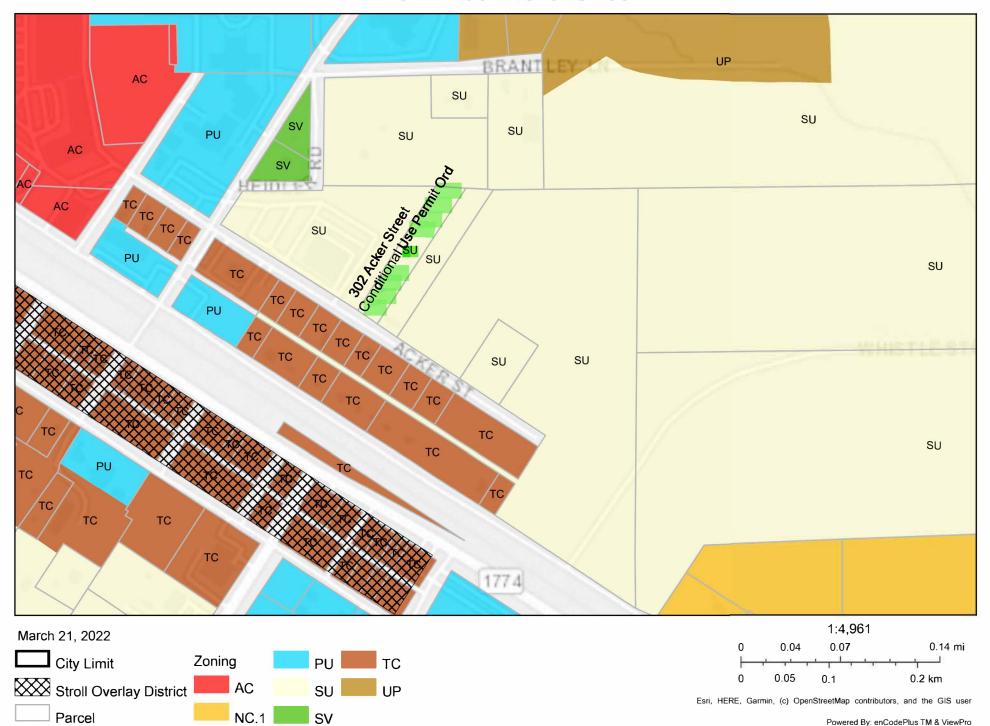

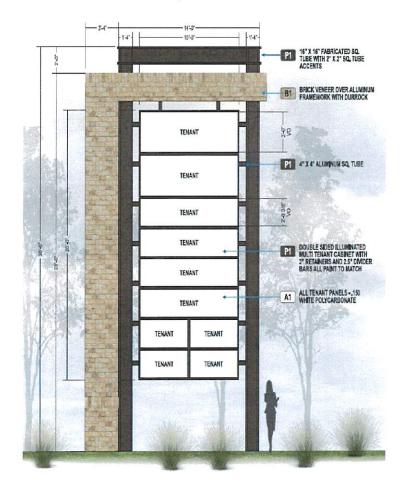

Lower Heights District - Houston, Texas

Land Area / Building Area

- Lower Heights District is a mixed-use land development at the SEC of Studemont and I-10 approximately 1.5 miles from downtown Houston. The development is a 4-part land assemblage that converts 30 acres of old industrial and manufacturing buildings to retail and multi-family uses.
- The retail shopping center component of the development is on 25 acres of the property and supports approximately 340,000 SF of gross leasable area.
- The multi-family project is on 5 acres of land and supports approximately 300 residential units.
- An additional 2 acres was conveyed to the City of Houston to extend and widen Summer Street.

Public Infrastructure Improvements

The public improvements required to facilitate the redevelopment of aged industrial/manufacturing buildings to a modern
mixed-use retail and residential district included significant environmental remediation, extension and upsizing of public
water, sanitary and stormwater lines, land dedications for new public roadway extensions, roadway widening and replacement,
and median replacement with new traffic signals to manage increased traffic flow. A hike and bike trail interconnect to White
Oak Bayou was also included.

Value Creation

- At completion the coordinated project will generate an increase in assessed ad valorem value to the City of Houston of \$250,000,000. At the current city tax rate that is an increase of \$1,500,000 per year in revenue to the City.
- Based on typical retail sales required to support the rent basis for infill mixed use projects, the sales tax revenue to the City at 1% of sales is approximately \$1,750,000 per year.

ORDINANCE NO. 0-2022-011

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS, AMENDING ARTICLE IV OF CHAPTER 94 "UTILITIES" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND MAKING OTHER PROVISION RELATED THERETO.

* * * * * *

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Magnolia, Texas has studied the present provisions of Chapter 94 "Utilities" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Magnolia; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is continually reviewing the provisions of the Code of Ordinances relating to the elimination of hazards and other circumstances which generally impact the health, safety and well-being of residents, citizens and inhabitants;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it has the power to regulate it municipal water system pursuant to chapter 552 of the Texas Local Government Code and the Texas Administrative Code, Title 30, Chapter 290; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it necessary to adopt the following amendments to Chapter 94 of the Code of Ordinances; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Findings. The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as findings of fact and conclusions of law by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes.

Section 2. Amendments. Article IV, of Chapter 94 entitled "Water" of the City of Magnolia Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by amending Division 1. "Generally" by adding a new section 94-126 as shown in attached Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein for all purposes.

<u>Section 3</u>. Repealing Clause. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed; provided, however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this ordinance shall be cumulative of other ordinances regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this ordinance.

<u>Section 4</u>. Severability. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance be severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences or sections of this ordinance, and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be enforced as written.

<u>Section 5</u>. Compliance Clause and Effective Date. The City Council finds, determines and declares that a sufficient written notice was posted, and this Ordinance was passed in accordance with the Open Meetings Act. The City Secretary is instructed to publish this Ordinance in the Official Newspaper of the City of Magnolia in the manner provided and for the time required by Section 52.011(a) of the Local Government Code, at which time this Ordinance takes effect.

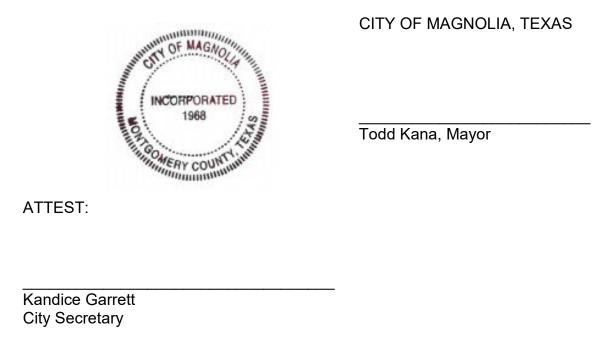


EXHIBIT "A"

CHAPTER 94

"UTILITIES"

ARTICLE IV. – WATER

DIVISION 1. – GENERALLY

Sec. 94-126. Wellhead protection.

- (a) The following requirements have been adopted to prevent pollution of water pumped from the wellheads of city-owned wells, as set out below:
 - (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to construct a tile or concrete sanitary sewer, sewer appurtenance, septic tank, storm sewer, or cemetery within 50 feet of a city water well. With respect to sanitary or storm sewers, it is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this item (1) that the sanitary or storm sewer is located ten feet or more from the city water well, is constructed of ductile iron or PVC pipe that meets American Water Works Association standards, has a minimum working pressure of 150 psi or greater, and is equipped with pressure type joints.
 - (2) It shall be unlawful for any person to allow livestock in pastures within 50 feet of a city water well.
 - (3) It shall be unlawful for any person to construct an on-site sewage facility tank perforated drain field, tank absorption bed, or tank evapotranspiration bed, or to construct a petroleum or chemical storage tank or liquid transmission pipeline within 150 feet of a city water well.
 - (4) It shall be unlawful for any person to irrigate an area within 150 feet of a city water well with spray from an on-site sewage facility.
 - (5) It shall be unlawful for any person to construct a water well within 150 feet of a city water well unless the well complies with all applicable state regulations.
 - (6) It shall be unlawful for any person to construct a sewage wet well or sewage pumping station within 300 feet of a city water well.
 - (7) It shall be unlawful for any person to construct a drainage ditch for industrial waste or sewage treatment waste within 300 feet of a city water well.
 - (8) It shall be unlawful for any person to construct a sewage treatment plant, animal feed lot, or solid waste disposal site within 500 feet of a city water well.
 - (9) It shall be unlawful for any person to apply sludge or effluent from a septic tank or sewage treatment plant on land with 500 feet of a city water well.
 - (10) It shall be unlawful for any person to drill an oil or gas well, including an injection well for recovery of oil or gas, within 500 feet of a city water well.
- (b) The department shall investigate existing facilities whether located within or without the distance requirements of subsection (a) and determine if those facilities are a pollution hazard to city well water. The department shall recommend acquisition of such

facilities in the event the department determines that the facilities are a pollution hazard to city well water and the owner refuses to take action necessary to abate the pollution hazard.

(c) Any person who violates any provision of this section shall be guilty of an offense and upon conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$500.00 nor more than \$2,000.00 for each violation. Each day in which a violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense. In addition to criminal prosecution, the legal department may seek appropriate judicial remedies to protect city ground water from contamination.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

THE STATE OF TEXAS

§

COUNTY OF MONTGOMERY §

This Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TEXAS, hereinafter referred to as "County," a political subdivision of the State of Texas acting herein by and through its County Judge and County Commissioners, and the CITY OF MAGNOLIA ("City") a body corporate and politic, organized under the General Laws of the State of Texas, acting herein by and through is City Council; hereafter called collectively ("Parties"):

RECITALS

WHEREAS, this Agreement is entered into pursuant to Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code which authorizes interlocal cooperation contracts between governmental entities for the purchase of goods and services;

WHEREAS, County and City have determined it would serve a public purpose and be in the best interest of the County and the City, and to the inhabitants thereof, that provisions be made for the repair and maintenance of public roads (hereinafter called "Project(s)"); and

WHEREAS, City is willing to reimburse the County for all costs and expenses associated with such Projects.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and considerations and undertakings herein set forth, it is agreed as follows:

- 1) City may request Precinct Commissioner to perform a project ("Project") within the scope of this Agreement. Each such request shall be in writing and be directed to the Precinct to determine if they want to participate in Project.
- 2) If the Precinct desires to proceed with Project, Precinct will review information provided by City and determine the estimated costs ("Estimate") to complete the Project. This Estimate will be returned to City for review and approval of Resolution and Order by the city council. Upon approval by the City of a Resolution and Order, that Order and the Estimate shall be returned to the Precinct and the Precinct will submit for consideration to the Montgomery County Commissioners Court to approve an Order Consenting to Street Repair and Maintenance by Montgomery County. (See Exhibit "A").
- 3) Nothing herein shall be deemed to require the Precinct or the County to consent to the performance of any work under this Agreement.
- 4) City hereby agrees that prior to submission to Montgomery County Commissioners Court, City shall confirm funds are available from its budget for the current fiscal year

and City further agrees that notwithstanding any Estimate provided, County shall be entitled to payment of all actual costs, including labor, materials, and equipment, incurred in the performance of work completed relating to Project, however in no event shall the actual costs be increased more than 25% of the Estimate without City approval.

- 5) Upon completion of Project, County shall provide City a statement of costs incurred for any work performed. City shall remit to County payment of such costs within thirty (30) days of receipt of the aforementioned statement.
- 6) This Agreement will be effective as of the date of the execution by the County and its term shall be one (1) year after the date hereof and shall be automatically renew and be deemed renewed annually until such time as either party provides thirty (30) days written notice of intent to terminate. Termination may only occur during periods of time when no Projects are currently underway and all outstanding payments for any Projects have been paid in full to County.
- 7) At no time will County obtain or provide any right of way for any Project(s). County will only maintain and repair roadway of existing footprint.
- 8) County shall have the right and authority to block streets and roadways, park equipment on rights of way and to do all things reasonably necessary to perform maintenance, repairs for any Project(s). County agrees to notify the City police department not less than 72 hours in advance of any street closures.
- 9) County shall not be liable for any delay in Projects. City understands and agrees that County shall perform such work on Project(s) only after, and subject to, County's fulfillment of its commitments and priorities on other county projects. Work will be conducted at the sole discretion of the Precinct.
- 10) Parties agree that, by entering into this Agreement, no intent exists to waive any claims or defenses including sovereign immunity or limitations of liability. EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, CITY SHALL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD COUNTY, ITS OFFICIALS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, AND OFFICERS HARMLESS FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL LAWSUITS, CLAIMS OF PERSONAL INJURY, LOSS, OR PROPERTY DAMAGE SUFFERED BY ANY PARTY, INCLUDING ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COURT COSTS, ARISING OUT OF, OCCASIONED BY, OR RELATED TO ANY ACT, OMMISSION, OR COMMISSION BY CITY DURING THE TERM AND PERFORMANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT. TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, COUNTY SHALL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD CITY, ITS OFFICIALS, AGENTS. EMPLOYEES, AND OFFICERS HARMLESS FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL LAWSUITS, CLAIMS OF PERSONAL INJURY, LOSS, OR PROPERTY DAMAGE SUFFERED BY ANY PARTY, INCLUDING ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COURT COSTS, ARISING OUT OCCASIONED BY, OR RELATED TO ANY ACT, OMMISSION, OR COMMISSION BY COUNTY DURING THE TERM AND PERFORMANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT.

- 11) Nothing in this Agreement shall alter or change the legal responsibility under existing law for maintenance and repairs from a party, nor will this Agreement cause County to incur any additional responsibility other than what responsibility it would have without this Agreement.
- 12) All notices, requests, demands and other communications under this Agreement shall be given by either United States First Class mail or by hand delivery addressed as

- 13) This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties. There have been and are no agreements, covenants, representations, or warranties between the parties other than those expressly stated or provided for herein. No modification hereof or subsequent agreement relative to the subject matter hereof shall be binding on any party unless reduced to writing and signed by the parties.
- 14) This Agreement shall be for the sole and exclusive benefit of City and the County and shall not be construed to confer any benefit or right upon any other party, including any landowner or resident of City or the County.
- 15) The provisions of this Agreement are severable, and if any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or other part of this Agreement or the application thereof to any other person or circumstance shall ever be held by any court of competent jurisdiction to contravene or be invalid under the constitution or laws of the State of Texas for any reason, that contravention or invalidity shall not invalidate the entire Agreement.
- 16) This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Venue shall be in Montgomery County, Texas.
- 17) This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each having equal force and effect of an original. This Agreement shall become binding and effective only after it

has been authorized and approved by the governing bodies of all parties, as evidenced by the signature of the appropriate authority.

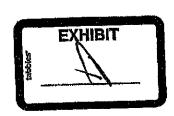

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A LOAN AGREEMENT FROM THE STATE INFRASTRUCTURE BANK; AUTHORIZING MAYOR TODD KANA TO ACT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA IN ALL MATTERS RELATING TO THE LOAN AGREEMENT.

WHEREAS, the State Infrastructure Bank, operated by the Texas Department of Transportation, is a revolving loan fund; and

WHEREAS, the City of Magnolia (the "City") deems it proper and in the best interest of the District to execute a loan agreement from the State Infrastructure Bank in the amount of Two Million Eight Hundred Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Seven Dollars and 50/100 Cents (\$2,803,157.50), such funds to be used for the costs of utility relocation in regards to a Texas Department of Transportation project to widen FM 1488, in the City of Magnolia, Montgomery County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City is qualified to apply for and obtain financial assistance from the State Infrastructure Bank for this purpose;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL (the "Council") OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS:

That the Council hereby accepts the State Infrastructure Bank loan agreement in its current substantially final form in order to secure receipt of funds in the amount of Two Million Eight Hundred Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Seven Dollars and 50/100 Cents (\$2,803,157.50), to be fully repaid over a period not over fifteen (15) years term to be used for the purpose of utility relocation necessary because of TxDOT project identified as CSJ # 0523-09-009 ("Project") to widen FM 1488 in the City of Magnolia, Montgomery County, Texas.

<u>Section 2</u>. That the Council hereby authorizes Todd Kana, Mayor of the City of Magnolia, to execute the State Infrastructure Bank loan agreement, together will all required documentation, to effectuate the City's intent to borrow such funds.

<u>Section 3</u>. That the City further authorizes its Mayor, including the City's Attorney, to take all actions necessary to finalize and submit the State Infrastructure Bank loan agreement, together with all required documentation, to the Texas Department of Transportation for consideration and approval.

STATE INFRASTRUCTURE BANK LOAN AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Secretary of Transportation of the United States Department of Transportation is authorized by the National Highway System Designation Act (Section 350 of Public Law 104-59) to enter into cooperative agreements with certain states, including Texas, to establish a state infrastructure bank for the purpose of making loans and providing other financial assistance to public and private entities, so as to encourage public and private investment in transportation facilities, expand the availability of funding for transportation projects, and reduce state costs; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Legislature established the State Infrastructure Bank (SIB) as an account in the State Highway Fund to be administered by the Texas Transportation Commission (Transportation Code, Chapter 222, Subchapter D); and

WHEREAS, the Texas Transportation Commission has adopted rules to implement the SIB program, including eligibility criteria for financial assistance (Title 43, Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Part 1, Chapter 6); and

WHEREAS, the Department is developing a project in Montgomery County, Texas to widen FM 1488, identified as CSJ # 0523-09-009 (Project). The Borrower is contributing \$2,803,157.50 to the Department for funding participation in the costs of utility relocation necessary for the Project pursuant to an Advance Funding Agreement for Voluntary Utility Relocation Contribution on State Highway Improvement Projects dated June 29, 2021, attached hereto as Exhibit E; and

WHEREAS, the Borrower is a public entity in Texas and is authorized by law to construct, maintain, or finance the Borrower's portion of the Project and may borrow money from the SIB under Texas Transportation Code §222.0745 for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with 43 TAC §6.23, the Borrower submitted an application to the Department seeking to borrow Two Million Eight Hundred Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2,803,157.50) from the SIB to pay for Borrower's contribution to the Department for the Project; and

WHEREAS, In accordance with 43 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §6.32(c)(2): (1) the Project is consistent with the Statewide Long-Range Transportation Plan; (2) the Project is in a Clean Air Act non-attainment area and will be consistent with the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program, with the conforming plan and Transportation Improvement Program for the applicable metropolitan planning organization, and with the State Implementation Plan; (3) the Project will improve the efficiency of the State's transportation systems; (4) the Project will expand the availability of funding for transportation Projects or reduce direct State costs; and (5) the application shows that the Project and the applicant are likely to have sufficient revenues to assure repayment of the financial assistance; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with 43 TAC §6.32(d)(1), a study of the social, economic, and environmental impact of the Project, consistent with the National Environmental Policy Act (42 U.S.C. §4321 et seq.), and Title 23, U.S.C. §109(h), and in compliance with the Department's environmental rules in 43 TAC Chapter 2, has been conducted as part of the Department's environmental assessment of the Project, and the Project was cleared pursuant to a Finding of No Significant Impact by the Department on July 2, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the Borrower passed Resolution No. R-2021-021 on August 10, 2021, authorizing the SIB loan application in the amount of up to Two Million Eight Hundred Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2,803,157.50). The above-referenced resolution is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with 43 TAC §6.32, the Department reviewed, analyzed, and found the application to be in compliance with the requirements of 43 TAC Chapter 6; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Transportation Commission, in Minute Order No. 116183 dated January 27, 2022, attached hereto as **Exhibit B**, granted final approval of the application from the Borrower to borrow up to Two Million Eight Hundred Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Eight Dollars (\$2,803,158) from the SIB, and authorized the Executive Director of the Department or his designee to enter into a financial assistance agreement with the Borrower to finance the Borrower's contribution to the Department for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Borrower also passed Resolution No. Enter resolution number. on Enter resolution date., authorizing the Borrower's Mayor to enter into this Agreement for a loan in the amount of Two Million Eight Hundred Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2,803,157.50), attached hereto as **Exhibit C**; and

WHEREAS, the Borrower has submitted a certificate warranting that the proposed security is eligible to be used to repay the loan and that the financial assistance will not violate any of the borrowing or bond commitments the borrower may have in place; and

WHEREAS, the Department has determined that the money in the SIB to be used to make the loan is "secondary funds" and "financial assistance from other than general obligation bond proceeds," as those terms are used in 43 TAC Chapter 6; and

WHEREAS, the Borrower will repay the loan with funds other than federal funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Department and the Borrower agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

Article 1. Financial Assistance.

- A. <u>SIB Loan.</u> The Department, on behalf of the Commission, will make a loan to the Borrower in the amount of Two Million Eight Hundred Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2,803,157.50) from the SIB (SIB Loan) to finance the actual costs of the Borrower's contribution to the Department for the Project.
- B. <u>SIB Loan Disbursement.</u> On March 15, 2022 (Deposit Date), the Department will transfer the amount of Two Million Eight Hundred Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2,803,157.50) from the SIB (SIB Loan Proceeds) to the Borrower for deposit with the Borrower's depository bank Woodforest National Bank, located in Magnolia, Texas, into an account established by the Borrower with its depository bank or investment pool as prescribed by state law (Project Account). The Borrower shall use the SIB Loan Proceeds for payment of the Borrower's contribution to the Department for the Project. The Borrower shall not use the SIB Loan Proceeds for any purpose other than that described in this Agreement.

The investment of any SIB Loan Proceeds shall be handled in a manner that complies with the Public Funds Investment Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 2256. The SIB Loan Proceeds shall be adequately collateralized in a manner that complies with the Public Funds Collateral Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 2257. The depository bank shall not commingle funds in the Project Account with any other funds held by the depository bank or the investment pool. If, during the course of this Agreement, the Borrower wishes to changes its depository bank or investment fund, the Borrower shall obtain the Department's approval prior to the transfer of any remaining SIB Loan Proceeds or any other funds into an equivalent account in the new depository bank or investment fund, subject to the same security and fund segregation requirements described in this Agreement.

C. Security Provisions.

(1) Pledge of Utility Revenues.

(A) Definitions: For all purposes of this Agreement, the following definitions shall apply:

"Gross Revenues" – All income, receipts and revenues of every nature derived or received from the operation and ownership (excluding refundable meter deposits, restricted gifts and grants in aid of construction) of the System, including earnings and income derived from the investment or deposit of money in any special funds or accounts created and established for the payment and security of obligations payable solely from and secured by a lien on and pledge of the Net Revenues.

"Operating and Maintenance Expenses" – All current expenses of operating and maintaining the System, including all salaries, labor, materials, repairs and extensions necessary to render efficient service; provided, however, that only such repairs and extensions, as in the judgment of the Borrower, reasonably and fairly exercised, are necessary to maintain the operations and render adequate service to the Borrower and the inhabitants thereof, or such as might be necessary to meet some physical accident or condition which would otherwise impair obligations payable from Net Revenues shall be deducted in determining Net Revenues. Depreciation charges shall not be considered Operating and Maintenance Expenses. Operating and Maintenance Expenses shall include payments under contracts for the purchase of water supply, electric power, and energy or natural gas (in the event of the acquisition of a gas distribution system) or the treatment of sewage and other materials, goods, services, or facilities for the System to the extent authorized by law and the provisions of such contract.

"Net Revenues" – Gross Revenues of the System, with respect to any period, after deducting the Operating and Maintenance Expenses during such period.

"Utility System" or "System" – All properties, facilities and plants currently owned, operated, and maintained by the Borrower for the supply, treatment, and transmission of treatedutility services, together with all future extensions, improvements, replacements and additions thereto; provided, however, that notwithstanding the foregoing, and to the extent now or hereafter authorized or permitted by law, the term "Utility System" or "System" shall not mean to include facilities of any kind which are declared not to be a part of the System and which are hereafter acquired or constructed by or on behalf of the Borrower with the proceeds from the issuance of "Special Facilities Bonds", which are hereby defined as being special revenue obligations of the Borrower which are payable from and secured by other liens on and pledges of special contract revenues or payments received from any other legal entity in connection with such facilities.

(B) Pledge of Utility System Net Revenues: The Borrower hereby covenants and agrees that the Net Revenues are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of amounts due to the Department from the Borrower under this Agreement. The pledge of Net Revenues granted by the Borrower shall be perfected in accordance with Chapter 9 or Chapter 261, Texas Business and Commerce Code. In order to preserve to the State the perfection of the security interest in said pledge, the Borrower agrees to make all Uniform Commercial Code filings necessary to perfect the Department's security interest in the Borrower's pledge of Net Revenues under Texas law, and to comply with the applicable provisions of Chapter 9 and Chapter 261, Texas Business and Commerce Code.

The Borrower covenants and agrees that Net Revenues will be used first to satisfy the Borrower's payment obligations to the Department under this Agreement, before using Net Revenues for any other purpose.

(C) Rates and Charges: The Borrower hereby agrees, while this Agreement is outstanding, to establish and maintain rates and charges for facilities and services afforded by the Utility System that are reasonably expected, on the basis of available information and experience and with due allowance for contingencies, to produce in each fiscal year:

(i) Gross Revenues to pay Operating and Maintenance Expenses; and

- (ii) Net Revenues sufficient to make the payments due to the Department under this Agreement and to pay all other indebtedness payable from and/or secured by a lien on the properties or revenues of the Utility System.
 - (D) Special Covenants: The Borrower further covenants and agrees as follows:
- (i) It has the lawful power to pledge the Net Revenues to the payments due to the Department under this Agreement as provided herein, and has lawfully exercised such power under the laws of the State of Texas;
- (ii) The Borrower shall set utility fees at rates needed to produce Utility System revenues sufficient to make payments on the SIB Loan when due;
- (iii) To the extent that it legally may and while this Agreement is outstanding, no franchise shall be granted for the installation or operation of any competing electric light and power, water, or wastewater system other than those owned by the Borrower;
- (iv) The pledge of Net Revenues to secure repayment of the SIB Loan is in compliance, and will not conflict with, any existing contract or other obligation secured by or payable from Utility System revenues; and
- (v) The Borrower may not sell or otherwise transfer all or a significant portion of the Utility System without providing for payment of the SIB Loan in full on or prior to such sale or transfer.

(2) Reserve Fund.

The Borrower shall maintain a fund at the Borrower's depository bank separate from all other funds and accounts for payment of the SIB Loan in the event of failure by the Borrower to make the required SIB Loan repayments on the required dates ("Reserve Fund"). As of the Deposit Date, the Borrower shall initiate Annual deposits in the Reserve Fund from available funds of the Borrower, commencing on or before the first day of the month following the Deposit Date (from operating revenues and/or from earnings on investments in the Reserve Fund) an amount not less than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) until the Reserve Fund contains at least Two Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$210,000) ("Required Reserve").

The Reserve Fund shall be maintained separately from any other reserve fund, and the Required Reserve shall not be affected by the issuance of additional debt in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement. The Reserve Fund shall be used to pay the principal of or interest on the SIB Loan at any time when there is not sufficient money available for such purpose.

For the purpose of determining the amount on deposit to the credit of the Reserve Fund, investments in which money in such account shall have been invested shall be computed at the market value of such investment. The amount on deposit to the credit of the Reserve Fund shall be computed by the Borrower at least annually, and shall be computed immediately upon any withdrawal from the Reserve Fund.

When and so long as the money and investments in the Reserve Fund total at least the amount of the Required Reserve, no deposits need be made to the credit of the Reserve Fund; but when and if the Reserve Fund at any time contains less than the Required Reserve (other than during the initial build-up period permitted in the first paragraph of this Section), the Borrower covenants and agrees to cure the deficiency in the required Reserve Fund within twelve (12) months from the date the deficiency in funds occurred. No investment of moneys held in the Reserve Fund shall have a maturity of greater than five years.

(3) Perfection of Security Interest.

Chapter 1208, Texas Government Code, applies to the execution and delivery of the SIB Loan and the pledge of revenues granted by the Borrower herein, and such pledge is therefore valid, effective, and perfected. If Texas law is amended at any time while the SIB Loan is outstanding and unpaid such that the pledge of revenues granted by the Borrower pursuant to the paragraph above is to be subject to the filing requirements of Chapter 9, Texas Business and Commerce Code, then in order to preserve to the Department the perfection of the security interest on the pledged revenues in Article I of this Agreement, the Borrower agrees to take such measures as it determines are reasonable and necessary under Texas law to comply with the applicable provisions of Chapter 9, Texas Business and Commerce Code, and enable a filing to perfect the security interest in said pledge to occur.

D. <u>Loan Repayment.</u> The SIB Loan is to be repaid over a period of no more than fifteen (15) years, with a final maturity date of August 1, 2036, in accordance with the amortization schedule attached to this Agreement as **Exhibit D**. Principal due on the SIB Loan shall be due annually beginning on August 1, 2022, and on each August 1 thereafter including the final principal payment date as shown on **Exhibit D** attached hereto (each a Principal Payment) as shown on **Exhibit D** attached hereto.

The SIB Loan shall not bear interest from the Deposit Date as shown on **Exhibit D** until January 1, 2023. Beginning January 1, 2023, the SIB loan shall bear interest at the rate of 1.47% per annum (Loan Rate), such interest to be calculated on the basis of a 360-day year composed of twelve 30-day months (each an Interest Payment). Interest Payments will be due annually beginning on February 1, 2023, and on each February 1 and August 1 thereafter in the years as shown on **Exhibit D** attached hereto (each an Interest Payment Date). The Principal Payment Dates and the Interest Payment Dates are collectively referred to as (Payment Dates). If a Payment Date is not on a business day, the Interest Payment and/or Principal Payment due shall be made on the next following business day.

E. <u>Draw of Funds from Project Account.</u> SIB Loan funds in the Project Account shall only be drawn upon by the Borrower and used for Project costs as described in this Agreement. All draws from the Project Account for such costs related to the Project shall be in

accordance with a requisition prepared by or approved by the Borrower, and all such requisitions and Project costs shall be subject to the review and approval of the Department.

- F. <u>Interest and Sinking Fund.</u> The Borrower shall establish at its depository bank a SIB Loan Interest and Sinking Fund. Interest Payments due on the SIB Loan and each Principal Payment due on the SIB Loan shall be deposited into this Interest and Sinking Fund by the Borrower prior to each Payment Date. On or before each Payment Date, the Borrower shall cause its depository bank to transfer from the SIB Loan Interest and Sinking Fund to the Department, the applicable Interest Payment and/or Principal Payment as set forth in this Agreement.
- G. <u>Advances.</u> The repayment of all or any portion of the SIB Loan shall not entitle the Borrower to any subsequent advances from the Department, nor shall the Department have any obligation to advance to or for the benefit of the Borrower any amount in excess of the SIB Loan. All costs incurred by the Borrower for its portion of the Project in excess of the par amount of the SIB Loan shall be the responsibility of the Borrower.

H. Prepayment.

- (1) <u>Voluntary Prepayment</u>. Principal due on the SIB Loan and interest accrued at the Loan Rate through and including the date of prepayment may be prepaid by the Borrower without penalty, in whole or in part, on any business day.
- (2) <u>Mandatory Prepayment</u>. Should the Project or this Agreement be terminated for any reason or should any amounts of disbursed SIB Loan Proceeds not be applied to pay Project costs, the Borrower shall return any misapplied SIB Loan Proceeds or unexpended portion of the SIB Loan Proceeds to the Department as a prepayment.
- (3) <u>Application of Prepayments</u>. Upon receipt of a prepayment from the Borrower of a portion (and not the whole) of the outstanding principal amount of the SIB Loan the Department shall apply such prepayment to the outstanding principal due on the SIB Loan:
- (4) Upon either voluntary or mandatory prepayment, the remaining principal due on the SIB Loan will be re-amortized over the term of the SIB Loan and **Exhibit D** will be revised by the Department to reflect the remaining Principal Payments and the revised Interest Payments due; and
- (5) Such revised **Exhibit D** shall be submitted to the Borrower to be attached to and become an integral part of this Agreement.
- I. <u>Late Payment</u>. Payments not received by the applicable Payment Date will bear interest at the Loan Rate (with overdue interest as well as overdue principal bearing interest) until paid. Such additional interest shall be calculated by the Department on the basis of a 360-day year composed of twelve 30-day months. The parties may prepare a revised **Exhibit D** (amortization schedule) showing the increase in interest due resulting from late payment, default, or pursuant to other terms and conditions of this Agreement.

J. <u>Payment with Federal Funds</u>. The Borrower hereby covenants and agrees that federal funds will not be used to make payments due on the SIB Loan.

Article 2. Use of SIB Loan for Project Costs

The Department is developing the Project. The Borrower is responsible to fund its share of the costs of relocating utilities necessary for the construction of the Project. The Borrower may use the SIB Loan only for the actual costs incurred by the Borrower for such utility relocation necessary for the construction of the Project.

Article 3. Project Responsibilities for Federally-Funded Projects

- A. The SIB Loan Proceeds are "secondary funds" and "financial assistance from other than general obligation bond proceeds," as those terms are used in 43 TAC Chapter 6. However, if any federal funds will be used to pay for, or reimburse costs of, the Project, with respect to work on the Project, the Borrower and the Department are required to comply with the requirements of the United States Code, Title 23, for federal-aid highways. The Borrower and the Department must conduct all right-of-way or other land acquisitions, relocations, and utility adjustments in accordance with the United States Code, Title 42 The Public Health and Welfare, Chapter 61 Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies for Federal and Federally Assisted Programs (the Uniform Act) and the regulations issued thereunder.
- B. The Borrower is responsible for funding its portion of Project costs in compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, policies, and ordinances. The Department has certain rights and responsibilities related to the Project, including ensuring that the completion of the Project is performed in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and policies.
- C. All plans and specifications for the Project shall be in compliance with the current editions of the design and construction manuals of the Department, and the Standard Specifications for the Construction and Maintenance of Highways, Streets, and Bridges (the "Standard Specifications"), as they may apply. All construction plans shall be signed and dated by a professional engineer licensed by the State of Texas.
- D. The actions and decisions regarding the Project made by the Department shall not be contestable by the Borrower.
- E. The Borrower shall provide the Department and the Federal Highway Administration, or their authorized representatives, with right of entry or access to all properties or locations necessary to perform the work for the Project, inspect the work, or otherwise aid in the prompt pursuit of the work. The Borrower shall also provide the Department, the Federal Highway Administration, the Comptroller General of the United States, and the Texas State Auditor's Office, or their authorized representatives, with right of access to any books, documents, papers, or other records of the Borrower which are pertinent to the Project or its financing as described in this Agreement, in order to make audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcripts, or to complete the Project accounting described in this Agreement.

Article 4. Project Accounting; Filing of Reports; Retention of Records

- A. The Borrower shall account for: (i) all actual costs associated with the Borrower's contribution to the Department for the Project, and (ii) disbursements made to the Department, if any, associated with the Project using generally accepted accounting principles in the United States, as promulgated by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board or the Financial Accounting Standards Board, or pursuant to applicable federal or state laws or regulations. The Borrower shall maintain its books and records in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States, as promulgated by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board or the Financial Accounting Standards Board, or pursuant to applicable federal or State laws or regulations, and with all other applicable federal and state requirements. The Borrower will make its accounting records available at reasonable times to the Department for inspection during performance of the Borrower's work related to the Project and upon its completion.
- B. On each Principal Payment Date (until the next Principal Payment Date occurring after the year in which all SIB Loan Proceeds are expended), the Borrower shall provide to the Department (one copy to the Department's District Office and one copy to the Department's SIB Administration Office) an accounting of the SIB Loan Proceeds expended (Annual Expenditure Report). The Borrower shall also, at the Borrower's cost, have a full audit of its books and records performed annually by an independent certified public accountant selected by the Borrower and reasonably acceptable to the Department. The audit must be conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards promulgated by the Financial Accounting Standards Board, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, or the standards of the Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, Audits of States, Local Governments and Non-profit Organizations, as applicable, and with all other applicable federal and state requirements. The Borrower shall cause the auditor to provide a full copy of the audit report and any other management letters or auditor's comments directly to the Department within a reasonable period of time after an audit report and any related documents have been provided to the Borrower's governing body.
- C. The State Auditor may conduct an audit or investigation of the Borrower with respect to the funds received from the Department directly under this Agreement or of the payments received by third parties from the Borrower using the SIB Loan Proceeds. Acceptance of funds directly under this Agreement or indirectly through payments using SIB Loan Proceeds acts as acceptance of the authority of the State Auditor, under the direction of the legislative audit committee, to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. An entity that is the subject of an audit or investigation must provide the State Auditor with access to any information the State Auditor considers relevant to the investigation or audit.
- D. The Borrower shall retain all original Project files, records, accounts, and supporting documents relating to the relocation of Borrower utilities needed for the Project until the later of the date that: (1) the Project is completed; (2) the SIB Loan has been paid in full; or (3) the retention period required by State and federal law ends. The Borrower shall retain, or cause its auditor to retain, all work papers and reports relating to an audit performed pursuant to this Agreement until the fourth anniversary of the date of the audit report, unless the Department notifies the Borrower in writing of a later date for the end of the retention

period. During the retention period, the Borrower shall make audit work papers available to the Department within 30 days of the date that the Department requests those papers.

- E. All information submitted by the Borrower (annual financial/disclosure information and notices) to the Electronic Municipal Market Access ("EMMA") System of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board with respect to the Borrower's bonds and other similar obligations payable from the same revenues as the SIB Loan must be submitted to the Department, within 30 days of posting to EMMA. Such information may be submitted to the Department by hard copy or by notification to the Department of the Borrower's posting with EMMA, together with the applicable CUSIP number(s).
- F. The Borrower shall submit to the Department within 30 days of the date of adoption the annual operating and capital budgets adopted by the Borrower each fiscal year under a trust agreement, indenture, bond resolution or ordinance, or equivalent document securing bonds or other obligations issued for a Project, and any amended or supplemental operating or capital budget, approved by the Borrower and certified as correct by its chief administrative officer or chief financial officer.

Article 5. Default

- A. The Borrower shall be in default if it fails to repay the SIB Loan (the Principal Payments and the Interest Payments) or otherwise fails to comply with any term of this Agreement. The Department shall not be obligated to take further action nor resume its obligations under this Agreement until the Borrower is no longer in default. The Borrower shall reimburse the Department for all costs or other losses of funds resulting from any default or failure to perform by the Borrower.
- B. The Borrower agrees that in the event of a default under this Agreement the Department may, by all legal and equitable means, require the Borrower and any appropriate official of the Borrower (acting solely in his/her official capacity) to remedy any default under, and carry out the provisions of, this Agreement, including specifically the use and filing of mandamus proceedings. Venue for any legal proceedings shall be in Travis County, Texas.

Article 6. Borrower Solely Responsible

The Borrower agrees that it is solely responsible for all losses, costs, expenses, penalties, claims, and liabilities due to activities of the Borrower and its agents, employees, officers, or contractors performed under this Agreement, and which result from an error, omission, or negligent act of the Borrower or any agent, employee, official, or contractor of the Borrower. Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, this provision shall survive any termination of this Agreement.

Article 7. Termination

This Agreement may be terminated upon the occurrence of any of the following conditions:

- A. If both parties to this Agreement agree in writing to such termination; provided, however, that any such termination is specifically subject to the requirements of this Agreement;
- B. If the Department is unable to advance the SIB Loan Proceeds to the Borrower, the Department shall terminate this Agreement and provide written notice thereof to the Borrower:
- C. If the Borrower is in default on a Principal Payment or Interest Payment required under this Agreement, the Department may declare this Agreement to be terminated, or may exercise any of the rights granted the Department in this Agreement; but the payment obligations of the Borrower shall survive any such termination and shall continue in effect until discharged and satisfied; and
- D. Upon repayment in full by the Borrower of the SIB Loan, and compliance by the Borrower with all other requirements of this Agreement, the Department shall execute and deliver to the Borrower a letter or other notice of payment, provided that, upon the execution and delivery of the written notice of payment by the Department, this Agreement shall automatically terminate, except with respect to any obligation of a party related to any losses, costs, expenses, penalties, claims, and liabilities due to the activities of a party, or any agent, employee, official, or contractor of a party, which obligations shall survive such termination.

Article 8. Notices

All notices to either party by the other party required under this Agreement will be delivered personally, via e-mail or sent by U.S. Mail, postage prepaid, addressed to such party at the following respective addresses:

All notices shall be deemed so delivered or deposited in the mail, unless otherwise provided herein. A party may change the above address by sending written notice of the change to the other party in the manner stated in this Article.

Article 9. Legal Construction

In case one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein. In particular, but not by way of limitation, should all or any part of the pledge of security in this Agreement for any reason be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any

respect, Borrower's obligations under this Agreement shall be treated as current expenses of the Borrower subject to the annual appropriation of lawfully available funds by the governing body of the Borrower for the payment of such obligations.

Article 10. Written Amendments

Any changes in the character, agreement, terms, or responsibilities of the parties must be enacted through a written amendment. No amendment to this Agreement shall be of any effect unless in writing and executed by both parties. Notwithstanding the foregoing, revisions to **Exhibit D** that occur as contemplated in this Agreement must be in writing, but are not required to be executed by either party.

Article 11. Successors and Assigns

Except as provided in the next following sentence, this Agreement shall bind, and shall be for the sole and exclusive benefit of, the respective parties. Each party is prohibited from assigning any of the rights or obligations conferred by this Agreement to any third party without the advance written approval of the other party. Any attempted assignment or other transfer of the rights or obligations of this Agreement without the consent of the other party shall be void and may be grounds for termination of this Agreement.

Article 12. Relationship of the Parties

Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed by the parties, or any third party, as creating the relationship of principal and agent between the Department and the Borrower.

Article 13. Interpretation

No provision of this Agreement shall be construed against or interpreted to the disadvantage of any party by any court or other governmental or judicial authority by reason of such party having or being deemed to have drafted, prepared, structured, or dictated such provision.

Article 14. Signatory Authority

Each party to this Agreement represents to the other that it is fully authorized to enter into this Agreement and to perform its obligations hereunder, and that no waiver, consent, approval, or authorization from any third party is required to be obtained or made in connection with the execution, delivery, or performance of this Agreement. Each signatory on behalf of the Department and the Borrower, as applicable, is fully authorized to bind that entity to the terms of this Agreement.

Article 15. Taxable Obligations

The SIB Loan is not a "state or local bond" within the meaning of section 103(a) and (c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; therefore, the interest on the SIB Loan is not excludable from the gross income of the holders thereof for federal income tax purposes.

The City of Magnolia (City) has submitted an application for financial assistance in the form of a loan of up to \$2,803,158 from the State Infrastructure Bank (SIB) under Transportation Code, Chapter 222, Subchapter D, and Title 43 Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Chapter 6 (SIB Rules). The application satisfies all requirements of the rules, including passage by the City of a resolution authorizing submission of the application to the Texas Department of Transportation (department).

The intended use of the financial assistance conforms to the purposes of the SIB. The City intends to use the financial assistance to pay the City's contribution to the department for funding participation for utility relocation necessary for a non-tolled state highway improvement project to widen Farm to Market 1488 in Montgomery County, Texas (project).

The present and projected financial condition of the SIB is sufficient to cover the requested financial assistance for the project.

The City has proposed a pledge of utility revenues as security for repayment of the loan.

In accordance with the SIB Rules, the executive director has negotiated all the terms of an agreement as necessary to protect the public's safety and to prudently provide for the protection of public funds while furthering the purposes of the SIB, as contained in the Term Sheet attached hereto as Exhibit A.

The SIB Rules allow for final approval by the Texas Transportation Commission (commission) of any SIB loan in the principal amount of \$10 million or less without first going through the preliminary approval process described in the SIB Rules if the financial assistance is to be used for a project for which the department has primary responsibility.

The executive director or his designee implemented actions authorized and required by the SIB Rules for final approval. The executive director affirms that the necessary social, economic, and environmental impact studies have been completed and approved by the department. The executive director recommends that the commission grant final approval of the City's application for financial assistance from the SIB.

In accordance with the SIB Rules, the commission finds that:

- 1. the project is consistent with the Statewide Long-Range Transportation Plan and the metropolitan transportation plan developed by the applicable metropolitan planning organization;
- 2. the project is in a Clean Air Act non-attainment area and is consistent with the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program, with the conforming plan and Transportation Improvement Program for the MPO in which the project is located, and with the State Implementation Plan;
 - 3. the project will improve the efficiency of the state's transportation systems;
- 4. the project will expand the availability of funding for transportation projects or reduce direct state costs;
- 5. the application shows that the City is likely to have sufficient revenues to assure repayment of the financial assistance;

- 6. providing financial assistance will protect the public's safety and prudently provide for the protection of public funds, while furthering the purposes of the SIB; and
- 7. the project will provide for all reasonable and feasible measures to avoid, minimize, or mitigate for adverse environmental impacts.

ADVANCE FUNDING AGREEMENT FOR VOLUNTARY UTILITY RELOCATION CONTRIBUTIONS ON STATE HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the State of Texas, acting through the Texas Department of Transportation ("State") and the City of Magnolia ("Utility"),

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Transportation Code, Chapters 201, 221, and 361, authorize the State to lay out, construct, maintain, and operate a system of streets, roads and highways that comprise the State Highway System; and,

WHEREAS, Transportation Code, Chapter 203, Subchapter E, Transportation Code §203.092 authorizes the State to regulate the placement of public utility facilities along a state highway; and,

WHEREAS, Texas Transportation Commission Minute Order Number 115814 authorizes the State to undertake and complete a highway improvement generally described as: the reconstruction and widening of FM 1488, from FM 1774 in Magnolia to West of FM 149 ("Project"); and,

WHEREAS, Utility possesses facilities that are affected by the above mentioned highway improvement and Utility, and the State agrees that it is more economical or efficient for such relocation to be effected by including said contract in the State's highway construction contract;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, to be by them kept and performed as hereafter set forth, the State and Utility do agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. Time Period Covered

This agreement becomes effective when signed by the last party whose signing makes the agreement fully executed, and the State and Utility will consider it to be in full force and effect until the Project described in this agreement has been completed and accepted by all parties or unless terminated, as provided.

2. Project Funding and Work Responsibilities

A. The State will authorize the performance of only those Project items of work which are eligible for relocation reimbursements or for which Utility has requested and has agreed to pay for as described in Attachment A - Payment Provision and Work Responsibilities, which

is attached to and made a part of this contract. In addition to identifying those items of work to be paid for by payments to the State, Attachment A - Payment Provision and Work Responsibilities, also specifies those Project items of work that are the responsibility of Utility and will be carried out and completed by Utility, at no cost to the State. The Utility shall be responsible for costs that are shown on Attachment B, Estimated Utility Costs, which is attached to and made a part of this agreement.

- B. If the Utility will perform any work under this contract for which reimbursement will be provided by or through the State, the Utility must complete training before a letter of authority is issued. Training is complete when at least one individual who is working actively and directly on the Project successfully completes and receives a certificate for the course entitled Local Government Project Procedures and Qualification for the Texas Department of Transportation. The Utility shall provide the certificate of qualification to the State. The individual who receives the training certificate may be an employee of the Utility or an employee of a firm that has been contracted by the Utility to perform oversight of the Project. The State in its discretion may deny reimbursement if the Utility has not designated a qualified individual to oversee the Project.
- C. Payment under this contract beyond the end of the current fiscal biennium is subject to availability of appropriated funds. If funds are not appropriated, this contract shall be terminated immediately with no liability to either party.

3. Termination

- A. This agreement may be terminated in the following manner:
 - 1. By mutual written agreement and consent of both parties:
 - 2. By either party upon the failure of the other party to fulfill the obligations set forth in this agreement; or
 - 3. By the State if it determines that the performance of the Project or utility work is not in the best interest of the State.
- **B.** If the agreement is terminated in accordance with the above provisions, Utility will be responsible for the payment of Project costs incurred by the State on behalf of Utility up to the time of termination.

4. Right of Access

If Utility is the owner of any part of the Project site, Utility shall permit the State or its authorized representative access to the site to perform any activities required to execute the work.

5. Adjustments Outside the Project Site

Utility will provide for all necessary right of way and utility adjustments needed for performance of the work on sites not owned or to be acquired by the State.

6. Responsibilities of the Parties and Indemnity

Utility acknowledges that it is not an agent, servant, employee of the State, nor is it engaged in a joint enterprise, and it is responsible for its own acts and deeds and for those of its agents or AFA Utility

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employees during the performance of the work on the Project. To the extent permitted by law, Utility agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the State, its agents and employees, from all suits, actions, or claims and from all liability and damages for any and all injuries or damages sustained by any person or property in consequence with the performance of design, construction, maintenance, or operation of the Utility facility. Such indemnity includes but is not limited to any claims or amounts arising or recovered under the "Worker's Compensation Law", the Texas Tort Claims Act, Chapter 101, Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code; or any other applicable laws or regulations, all as time to time may be amended.

7. Sole Agreement

In the event the terms of the agreement are in conflict with the provisions of any other existing agreements between Utility and the State, the latest agreement shall take precedence over the other agreements in matters related to the Project.

8. Successors and Assigns

The State and Utility each binds itself, its successors, executors, assigns, and administrators to the other party to this agreement and to the successors, executors, assigns, and administrators of such other party in respect to all covenants of this agreement.

9. Amendments

By mutual written consent of the parties, the scope of work and payment provisions of this agreement may be amended prior to its expiration.

10. Inspection and Conduct of Work

Unless otherwise specifically stated in Attachment A - Payment Provision and Work Responsibilities, to this contract, the State will supervise and inspect all work performed hereunder and provide such engineering inspection and testing services as may be required to ensure that the Project is accomplished in accordance with the approved plans and specifications. All correspondence and instructions to the contractor performing the work will be the sole responsibility of the State. Unless otherwise specifically stated in Attachment A to this contract, all work will be performed in accordance with the Utility Accommodation Rules as set forth in 43 Texas Administrative Code §21.31 et. seq. adopted by the State and incorporated in this agreement by reference, or special specifications approved by the State.

11. Maintenance

Upon completion of the Project, Utility will assume responsibility for the maintenance of the completed Utility facility unless otherwise specified in Attachment A to this agreement.

12. Notices

All notices to either party by the other required under this agreement shall be delivered personally or sent by certified or U.S. mail, postage prepaid, addressed to such party at the following addresses:

Acceptance of funds directly under this contract or indirectly through a subcontract under this contract acts as acceptance of the authority of the state auditor, under the direction of the legislative audit committee, to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. An entity that is the subject of an audit or investigation must provide the state auditor with access to any information the state auditor considers relevant to the investigation or audit.

14. Signatory Warranty

Each signatory warrants that the signatory has necessary authority to execute this agreement on behalf of the entity represented.

15. Access to Information

The Utility is required to make any information created or exchanged with the state pursuant to this contract, and not otherwise excepted from disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act, available in a format that is accessible by the public at no additional charge to the state.

The parties agree that the existing sanitary sewer and waterline shall be relocated and adjustments shall be made along FM 1488, from FM 1744 in Magnolia, to West of FM 149. The sanitary sewer and waterline facilities shall be owned, operated, and maintained by Utility from and after completion and final acceptance by the State and Utility. The estimated total construction cost for the relocated and adjusted facilities is \$2,803,157.50. The parties agree that it is their intent to complete the relocation improvements within this estimate of cost.

2. Actual Cost Agreement

Utility will be responsible for paying all costs associated with the planning, specification, and estimate (PS&E) development, and construction of the proposed utility work to the extent such is not reimbursed pursuant to state law. All the costs associated with construction of the sanitary sewer and waterline items for the Project shall be provided as defined under the Standard Utility Agreement, Utility Joint Use Agreement, and/or the Agreement to Contribute Funds executed between the State and Utility.

3. Schedule of Payments

- A. At least forty-five (45) days prior to the date set for receipt of the construction bids, the Utility shall remit its remaining financial share for the State's estimated construction oversight and construction costs. Utility must advance to the State one hundred percent (100%) of its share of the estimated Project utility construction costs. The amount to be advanced for the utility improvements is estimated to be \$ 2,803,157.50. (See Attachment B Estimated Utility Costs)
- **B.** If the Utility applies, and is approved for, a State Infrastructure Bank (SIB) Loan, the Utility must remit payment within 45 days of receipt of potential SIB Loan proceeds to pay for the Project.
- C. In the event the State determines that additional funding is required by the Utility at any time during the Project, the State will notify the Utility in writing. The Utility is responsible for one hundred percent (100%) of the authorized project cost and any overruns. The Utility will make payment to the State within thirty (30) days from receipt of the State's written notification.
- **D.** Whenever funds are paid by the Utility to the State under this agreement, the Utility will remit a warrant made payable to the "Texas Department of Transportation." The warrant will be deposited by the State and managed by the State. Until the final Project accounting, funds may only be applied by the State to the Project.
- E. Upon completion of the Project, the State will perform an audit of the Project costs. Any funds due by the Utility, the State, or the Federal Government will be promptly paid by the owing party.

4. Work Responsibilities

A. The Utility shall provide the following services under this contract:

- Responsible for engaging the services of a Texas Registered Professional Engineer to prepare drawings and technical specifications for waterline relocations and adjustments along FM 1488, from FM 1774 in Magnolia to West of FM 149.
- ii. Provide the plans and specifications to the State to include in the current planning specifications and estimate package being prepared by representatives of the Texas Department of Transportation's Montgomery Area Office.
- iii. Secure all necessary permitting as may be required for the installation of the sanitary sewer and waterline.
- iv. Arrange and coordinate with the contractor, through the State, materials and equipment testing, rejection of all work not conforming to minimum requirements of the construction contract documents, maintenance of the proposed sanitary sewer and waterline during construction, and the relocation of sanitary sewer and waterline and connection of services to customers.
- v. Advise the State of work that Utility determines should be corrected or rejected.
- vi. Arrange, observe, and inspect all acceptance testing and notify the State of the results of these activities.
- vii. Provide inspection services for the construction, notify the State of defects and deficiencies in the work, and observe actions of the contractor to correct such defects and deficiencies.
- viii. Assume all responsibility for the maintenance of the existing sanitary sewer and waterline during and upon completion of the construction contract.
- ix. Ensure all Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and all other regulatory rules, regulations and laws are strictly adhered to.
- x. Prepare and submit both a certificate of substantial completion and a list of observed items requiring completion or correction for the relocations and adjustments to the Project Engineer for concurrence.
- xi. Coordinate all construction activities performed by Utility's staff for the relocations and adjustments through the Project Engineer.
- B. The State shall provide the following services under this contract:
 - Combine the sanitary sewer and waterline relocation and adjustment plans with the plans being prepared for the Project.
 - ii. Review and approve the final construction plans prior to any construction-related activities. In order to ensure federal and/or state funding eligibility, projects must be authorized by the State prior to advertising for construction.
 - iii. Advertise for construction bids, issue bid proposals, receive and tabulate the bids, and award and administer the contract for construction of the Project.
 - iv. Negotiate and administer all field changes and change orders required for the Project. All change orders increasing construction costs for Utility's Project shall be submitted to Utility for review and approval together with an evaluation. Utility agrees to review and either approve or disapprove all change orders within five (5) business days after receipt of such order unless Utility Board's approval is necessary in which case Utility shall bring the item to Utility Board as soon as reasonably possible.

- v. Provide overall project management to supervise the day-to-day activities of the construction and monitor the activities of the contractor to promote the timely and efficient completion of the Project in accordance with the approved Plans and Specifications and construction schedule.
- vi. Conduct field observations and coordinate with Utility's inspectors and the contractor to cure defects and deficiencies in the construction prior to final acceptance.
- vii. Make timely payment to the contractor for work performed in connection with the Project.
- viii. Ensure access and permit Utility's inspectors and other authorized representatives to inspect the waterline construction at all times.
- ix. Conduct and coordinate final inspection of the Project in the presence of Utility's Engineer and Inspector, transmit final list of items to be completed or repaired and observe contractor correction of same.
- x. Maintain iob file.

 - C. City Council Meeting (1) (Final Plan)
 - 7.2 *Public Outreach:*
 - A. *Public Meetings:* Prepare advertisement, exhibits, handouts, and attend two Public Meetings/Open House events. Outreach will advertise at existing community events (example: Magnolia Showdown Barbecue Cookoff). Prepare meeting minutes to document public comments.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO WHOLESALE WATER SUPPLY

AND SANITARY SEWER AGREEMENT

This SECOND AMENDMENT TO WHOLESALE WATER SUPPLY AND SANITARY SEWER AGREEMENT (this "Second Amendment") is made and entered into effective as of March 8, 2022 (the "Second Amendment Date"), by and among THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS, a general law municipality in Montgomery County, Texas, acting by and through its governing body, the City Council of Magnolia, Texas (the "City"), AUDUBON MAGNOLIA DEVELOPMENT, LLC, a Texas limited liability company, or its successors and assigns (the "Owner"), MONTGOMERY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 130, a political subdivision of the State of Texas organized under Article XVI, Section 59 of the Constitution of the State of Texas and operating pursuant to and governed by the provisions of Chapters 49 and 54, Texas Water Code, as amended ("No. 130"), MONTGOMERY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 131, a political subdivision of the State of Texas organized under Article XVI, Section 59 of the Constitution of the State of Texas and operating pursuant to and governed by the provisions of Chapters 49 and 54, Texas Water Code, as amended ("No. 131"), MONTGOMERY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 154A, a political subdivision of the State of Texas organized under Article XVI, Section 59 of the Constitution of the State of Texas and operating pursuant to and governed by the provisions of Chapters 49 and 54, Texas Water Code, as amended ("No. 154A"), MONTGOMERY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 154B, a political subdivision of the State of Texas organized under Article XVI, Section 59 of the Constitution of the State of Texas and operating pursuant to and governed by the provisions of Chapters 49 and 54, Texas Water Code, as amended ("No. 154B"), and AUDUBON MANAGEMENT DISTRICT, a political

subdivision of the State of Texas organized and operating pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 3979 of the Texas Special District Local Laws Code, Sections 52 and 52-a of Article III of the Texas Constitution, Section 59 of Article XVI of the Texas Constitution, Chapter 375 of the Texas Local Government Code, and the applicable provisions of Chapter 49 and Chapter 54 of the Texas Water Code, as amended (the "Management District"). The City, the Owner, No. 130, No. 131, No. 154A, No. 154B and the Management District are each individually at times referred to herein as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties." No. 130, No. 131, No. 154A, No. 154B and the Management District are each individually at times referred to herein as a "District" and collectively as the "Districts."

RECITALS

- A. The City, Magnolia 1138, Ltd., a Texas limited partnership ("Magnolia 1138"), predecessor in interest to the Owner, No. 130 and No. 131 have previously entered into that certain Wholesale Water Supply and Sanitary Sewer Agreement, dated effective as of January 13, 2015 (the "Original Agreement"). Pursuant to Section 6.13 of the Original Agreement: (i) Magnolia 1138 assigned the Agreement to 1488 Corp., a Texas corporation ("1488 Corp."), and (ii) 1488 Corp. subsequently assigned the Agreement to the Owner.
- B. The City and Magnolia 1138, predecessor in interest to the Owner, have also previously entered into that certain Land Use Planning and Cooperation Agreement, dated effective as of November 8, 2011 (the "Original Land Use Agreement"). Pursuant to Section 9.04 of the Original Land Use Agreement: (i) Magnolia 1138 assigned the Original Land Use Agreement to 1488 Corp., and (ii) 1488 Corp. subsequently assigned the Agreement to the Owner. In order to make certain changes to the Original Land Use Agreement, the City and the

Owner entered into that certain First Amendment to Land Use Planning and Cooperation Agreement, dated effective as of May 8, 2018 (the "First Amendment to Land Use Agreement"). The Original Land Use Agreement, as amended by the First Amendment to Land Use Agreement, is herein referred to as the "Land Use Agreement.")

- C. The Land Use Agreement provides that, pursuant to certain terms and conditions included therein, additional municipal utility districts, municipal management districts, or other special districts may be created under general law or through one or more acts of the Texas Legislature for the purpose or purposes of financing, planning, constructing, operating, maintaining or otherwise providing for Public Improvements (as such term is defined in the Land Use Agreement) to all of or any portion of the Property (as such term is defined in the Land Use Agreement) ("Special Districts").
- D. Montgomery County Municipal Utility District No. 154 ("No. 154") was created by House Bill 1440, 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, codified as Section 7974 of the Texas Special District Local Laws Code (the "No. 154 Creation Act").
- E. In order to make certain changes to the Original Agreement including, adding No. 154 as a party, the City, the Owner, No. 130, No. 131, and No. 154 entered into that certain First Amendment to Wholesale Water Supply and Sanitary Sewer Agreement, dated effective as of June 12, 2018 (the "First Amendment").
- F. Pursuant to Section 7974.106 of the No. 154 Creation Act, on January 30, 2020, the Board of Directors of No. 154 adopted an Order Dividing District and Redefining Boundaries (the "Order Dividing") which, among other things: (i) divided No. 154 into No. 154A and No. 154B, (ii) renamed No. 154 as No. 154A, and (iii) allocated the assets and liabilities of No. 154

between No. 154A and No. 154B by providing that No. 154A assumed all assets and liabilities of No. 154 (except certain expenses relating to the division of No. 154), including all rights, benefits, covenants, duties and obligations of No. 154 as set forth in the Agreement.

- G. The City, the Owner, No. 130, No. 131, and No. 154A have previously entered into that certain First Addendum to Wholesale Water Supply and Sanitary Sewer Agreement, dated effective as of September 19, 2020, as amended by that certain First Amendment to First Addendum to Wholesale Water Supply and Sanitary Sewer Agreement, dated effective as of November 9, 2021 (collectively, the "First Addendum"). (The Original Agreement, as amended by the First Amendment and supplemented by the First Addendum, is herein referred to as the "Agreement.")
- H. Each of No. 130, No. 131, No. 154A and No. 154B are conservation and reclamation districts created and organized for purposes, among others, of supplying water for municipal, domestic and commercial uses and protecting, preserving, and restoring the purity and sanitary condition of water within the State of Texas, and are empowered to collect, transport, process, dispose of, and control domestic and commercial wastes.
- I. The Management District was created by House Bill 4657, 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, codified as Section 3979 of the Texas Special District Local Laws Code. The Management District is a municipal management district created and organized for purposes, among others, of: (i) providing water, sanitary sewer and drainage facilities and services to land within and without its jurisdictional boundaries, (ii) promoting the health, safety and general welfare of residents, employers, potential employees, employees, visitors and consumers in the Management District, and of the public, and (iii) providing needed funding for

the Management District to preserve, maintain and enhance the economic health and vitality of the Management District's territory as a community and business center.

- J. Pursuant to Section 2.4 of the First Amendment, the City, the Owner, No. 130, No. 131 and No. 154A agreed that: (i) additional Special Districts may be required to serve the Property (as such term is defined in the Agreement), and (ii) if any such Special Districts are created, the City, the Owner, No. 130, No. 131 and No. 154A would execute an amendment to the Agreement adding such Special Districts as Parties to the Agreement.
- K. In completion of their obligation pursuant to Section 2.4 of the First Amendment, the Parties now desire to amend the Agreement to include No. 154B and the Management District as Parties to the Agreement and make certain other amendments and modifications to the Agreement.
- L. The Parties have determined that they are each independently authorized to enter into this Second Amendment and the Parties acknowledge that they are proceeding in good faith and in reliance upon the purposes, intent, effectiveness and enforceability of this Second Amendment and the Agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises and the mutual agreements, covenants, benefits and obligations set forth and contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the City, the Owner, No. 130, No. 131, No. 154A, No. 154B and the Management District contract and agree as follows:

ARTICLE I

RECITALS; DEFINITIONS; INTERPRETATION

Section 1.1 <u>Recitals</u>. The recitals set forth above are declared true and correct and are hereby incorporated as part of this Second Amendment.

Section 1.2 <u>Titles, Headings and Exhibits.</u>

1.2.1 The titles, headings and captions appearing in the articles of this Second Amendment and following each numbered section of this Second Amendment are inserted and included solely for convenience and shall never be considered or given any effect in construing this Second Amendment or the Agreement, or any provisions hereof, or in connection with the duties, obligations or liabilities of the respective Parties hereto or in ascertaining intent, if any questions of intent should arise.

Section 1.3 Interpretation of Second Amendment.

- 1.3.1 This Second Amendment and all terms and provisions hereof shall be liberally construed to effectuate the purposes set forth herein and to sustain the validity of this Second Amendment and the Agreement.
- 1.3.2 Unless the context requires otherwise, words of the masculine gender shall be construed to include correlative words of the feminine and neuter genders and *vice versa*, and words of the singular number shall be construed to include correlative words of the plural number and *vice versa*. The word "include," and any of its derivatives, shall be interpreted as language of example and not of limitation, and shall be deemed to be followed by the words "without limitation," unless otherwise expressly provided herein.

1.3.3 The Parties agree that this Second Amendment, and the Agreement as amended by this Second Amendment, shall not be construed in favor of or against a Party on the basis that the Party did or did not author this Second Amendment.

Section 1.4 Definitions.

1.4.1 Unless otherwise specifically set forth in this Second Amendment, all capitalized terms used herein shall have the meanings set forth in the Agreement.

ARTICLE II

ADDITION OF PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT

- Section 2.1 Addition of No. 154B and the Management District as Parties.
- 2.1.1 As of the Second Amendment Date, No. 154B: (i) joins in the Agreement, (ii) acknowledges, consents to and agrees to be bound by all of the terms and conditions of the Agreement, and (iii) accepts all of the rights, benefits, covenants, duties and obligations of a District under the Agreement.
- 2.1.2 As of the Second Amendment Date, the Management District: (i) joins in the Agreement, acknowledges, consents to and agrees to be bound by all of the terms and conditions of the Agreement, and (iii) accepts all of the rights, benefits, covenants, duties and obligations of a District under the Agreement.
- 2.1.3 The Agreement is amended by replacing the definitions of a "<u>District</u>" and the "<u>Districts</u>" with the following definitions:

No. 130, No. 131, No. 154A, No. 154B and the Management District are each individually at times referred to herein as a "District" and collectively as the "Districts."

Section 2.2 <u>Service Area</u>. The Parties acknowledge and agree that, as of the Second Amendment Date, all of the land within the jurisdictional boundaries of No. 154B and the Management District is included within the Property (as such term in defined in the Agreement).

ARTICLE III

REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

- Section 3.1 <u>The City</u>. The City represents and warrants to the Owner, No. 130, No. 131, No. 154A, No. 154B and the Management District that, as of the Second Amendment Date:
- 3.1.1 It is a general law city duly organized, validly existing and operating under the laws of the State of Texas;
- 3.1.2 It has full power, authority and legal right to execute and deliver this Second Amendment and to perform and observe the terms and provisions hereof;
- 3.1.3 The form, execution, delivery and performance by the City of this Second Amendment have been duly authorized by all necessary action and does not violate or contravene any law or any order of any court or governmental agency or any agreement or other instrument to which the City is a party or by which it or any of its properties may be bound; and
- 3.1.4 This Second Amendment is a legal, valid and binding obligation of the City enforceable against the City in accordance with its terms except that enforceability of the City's obligations hereunder may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights in general and is subject to general principles of

equity (regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding in equity or at law).

- Section 3.2 <u>The Owner.</u> The Owner represents and warrants to each of the City, No. 130, No. 131, No. 154A, No. 154B and the Management District that, as of the Second Amendment Date:
- 3.2.1 It is a limited liability company duly organized, validly existing and operating under the laws of the State of Texas;
- 3.2.2 It has full power, authority and legal right to execute and deliver this Second Amendment and to perform and observe the terms and provisions hereof;
- 3.2.3 The form, execution, delivery and performance by the Owner of this Second Amendment have been duly authorized by all necessary action and does not violate or contravene any law or any order of any court or governmental agency or any agreement or other instrument to which the Owner is a party or by which it or any of its properties may be bound; and
- 3.2.4 This Second Amendment is a legal, valid and binding obligation of the Owner enforceable against the Owner in accordance with its terms except that enforceability of the Owner's obligations hereunder may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights in general and is subject to general principles of equity (regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding in equity or at law).

- Section 3.3 No. 130. No. 130 represents and warrants to the City, the Owner, No. 131, No. 154A, No. 154B and the Management District that, as of the Second Amendment Date:
- 3.3.1 It is a municipal utility district duly organized, validly existing and operating under the laws of the State of Texas;
- 3.3.2 It has full power, authority and legal right to execute and deliver this Second Amendment and to perform and observe the terms and provisions hereof;
- 3.3.3 The form, execution, delivery and performance by No. 130 of this Second Amendment have been duly authorized by all necessary action and does not violate or contravene any law or any order of any court or governmental agency or any agreement or other instrument to which No. 130 is a party or by which it or any of its properties may be bound; and
- 3.3.4 This Second Amendment is a legal, valid and binding obligation of No. 130 enforceable against No. 130 in accordance with its terms except that enforceability of No. 130's obligations hereunder may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights in general and is subject to general principles of equity (regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding in equity or at law).
- Section 3.4 No. 131. No. 131 represents and warrants to the City, the Owner, No. 130, No. 154A, No. 154B and the Management District that, as of the Second Amendment Date:
- 3.4.1 It is a municipal utility district duly organized, validly existing and operating under the laws of the State of Texas;

- 3.4.2 It has full power, authority and legal right to execute and deliver this Second Amendment and to perform and observe the terms and provisions hereof;
- 3.4.3 The form, execution, delivery and performance by No. 131 of this Second Amendment have been duly authorized by all necessary action and does not violate or contravene any law or any order of any court or governmental agency or any agreement or other instrument to which No. 131 is a party or by which it or any of its properties may be bound; and
- 3.4.4 This Second Amendment is a legal, valid and binding obligation of No. 131 enforceable against No. 131 in accordance with its terms except that enforceability of No. 131's obligations hereunder may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights in general and is subject to general principles of equity (regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding in equity or at law).
- Section 3.5 No. 154A. No. 154A represents and warrants to the City, the Owner, No. 130, No. 131, No. 154B and the Management District that, as of the Second Amendment Date:
- 3.5.1 It is a municipal utility district duly organized, validly existing and operating under the laws of the State of Texas;
- 3.5.2 It has full power, authority and legal right to execute and deliver this Second Amendment and to perform and observe the terms and provisions hereof;
- 3.5.3 The form, execution, delivery and performance by No. 154A of this Second Amendment have been duly authorized by all necessary action and does not violate or contravene any law or any order of any court or governmental agency or any agreement or other

instrument to which No. 154A is a party or by which it or any of its properties may be bound; and

- 3.5.4 This Second Amendment is a legal, valid and binding obligation of No. 154A enforceable against No. 154A in accordance with its terms except that enforceability of No. 154A's obligations hereunder may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights in general and is subject to general principles of equity (regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding in equity or at law).
- Section 3.6 No. 154B. No. 154B represents and warrants to the City, the Owner, No. 130, No. 131, No. 154A and the Management District that, as of the Second Amendment Date:
- 3.6.1 It is a municipal utility district duly organized, validly existing and operating under the laws of the State of Texas;
- 3.6.2 It has full power, authority and legal right to execute and deliver this Second Amendment and to perform and observe the terms and provisions hereof;
- 3.6.3 The form, execution, delivery and performance by No. 154B of this Second Amendment have been duly authorized by all necessary action and does not violate or contravene any law or any order of any court or governmental agency or any agreement or other instrument to which No. 154B is a party or by which it or any of its properties may be bound; and
- 3.6.4 This Second Amendment is a legal, valid and binding obligation of No. 154B enforceable against No. 154B in accordance with its terms except that enforceability of No.

154B's obligations hereunder may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights in general and is subject to general principles of equity (regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding in equity or at law).

- Section 3.7 <u>The Management District</u>. The Management District represents and warrants to the City, the Owner, No. 130, No. 131, No. 154A and No. 154B that, as of the Second Amendment Date:
- 3.7.1 It is a municipal management district duly organized, validly existing and operating under the laws of the State of Texas;
- 3.7.2 It has full power, authority and legal right to execute and deliver this Second Amendment and to perform and observe the terms and provisions hereof;
- 3.7.3 The form, execution, delivery and performance by The Management District of this Second Amendment have been duly authorized by all necessary action and does not violate or contravene any law or any order of any court or governmental agency or any agreement or other instrument to which The Management District is a party or by which it or any of its properties may be bound; and
- 3.7.4 This Second Amendment is a legal, valid and binding obligation of The Management District enforceable against The Management District in accordance with its terms except that enforceability of The Management District's obligations hereunder may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights in general and is subject to general principles of equity (regardless of whether such enforceability is considered in a proceeding in equity or at law).

ARTICLE IV

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 4.1 <u>Amendment to Addresses and Notice</u>. Article VI of the Agreement is amended by (i) deleting the notice addresses for each of the Districts in Section 6.11, and (ii) replacing such addresses with the following:

Section 4.2 <u>Continuing Effect</u>. Except as modified or amended in this Second Amendment, all terms and provisions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect without modification or amendment and shall apply to this Second Amendment; provided, however, that this Second Amendment shall control in the event of any conflict between the provisions of the Second Amendment and the Agreement.

Section 4.3 <u>Land Use Agreement</u>. The Parties expressly acknowledge and agree that the Property is subject to the Land Use Agreement and, furthermore, nothing in the Agreement, as amended by this Second Amendment, is intended to terminate, supersede or otherwise modify any of the terms of the Land Use Agreement. If any of the terms and conditions of the Agreement, as amended by this Second Amendment, conflict with the terms and conditions of the Land Use Agreement, the terms and conditions of the Land Use Agreement shall take precedence and control.

Section 4.4 <u>No Further Amendments</u>. This Second Amendment and the Agreement constitute the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersede all prior contemporaneous negotiations, understandings and agreements. This Second Amendment may only be modified or amended by a written instrument executed by all of the Parties.

Section 4.5 <u>Severability</u>. The provisions of this Second Amendment are severable, and if any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, section or other part of this Second Amendment or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall ever be held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional for any reason, the remainder of

this Second Amendment and the application of such word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, section or other part of this Second Amendment to any other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Section 4.6 <u>Statutory Representations</u>.

- 4.6.1 As required by 2274.002, Texas Government Code (as added by Senate Bill 13, 87th Texas Legislature, Regular Session), as amended, AMD hereby verifies that AMD, including any wholly owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary, parent company or affiliate of the same, does not boycott energy companies, and will not boycott energy companies during the term of this Agreement. As used in the foregoing verification, "boycott energy companies" shall have the meaning assigned to the term "boycott energy company" in Section 809.001, Texas Government Code, as amended.
- 4.6.2 As required by Section 2274.002, Texas Government Code (as added by Senate Bill 19, 87th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, "SB 19"), as amended, AMD hereby verifies that AMD, including any wholly owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary, parent company or affiliate of the same, (i) does not have a practice, policy, guidance or directive that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association, and (ii) will not discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association during the term of this Agreement. As used in the foregoing verification, "discriminate against a firearm entity or trade association" shall have the meaning assigned to such term in Section 2274.001(3), Texas Government Code (as added by SB 19), as amended.
- 4.6.3 As required by Chapter 2271, Texas Government Code, as amended, AMD hereby verifies that AMD, including any wholly owned subsidiary, majority-owned

subsidiary, parent company or affiliate of the same, does not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel through the term of this Agreement. As used in the foregoing verification, the term "boycott Israel" has the meaning assigned to such term in Section 808.001, Texas Government Code, as amended.

4.6.4 Pursuant to Chapter 2252, Texas Government Code, AMD represents and certifies that, at the time of execution of this Agreement neither AMD, nor any wholly owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary, parent company or affiliate of the same, is a company listed by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts under Sections 2270.0201 or 2252.153 of the Texas Government Code.

Section 4.7 <u>Counterparts</u>. This Second Amendment may be executed in seven (7) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which together shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

Section 4.8 <u>Term</u>. This Second Amendment shall continue in full force and effect until the Agreement is terminated in accordance with its terms.

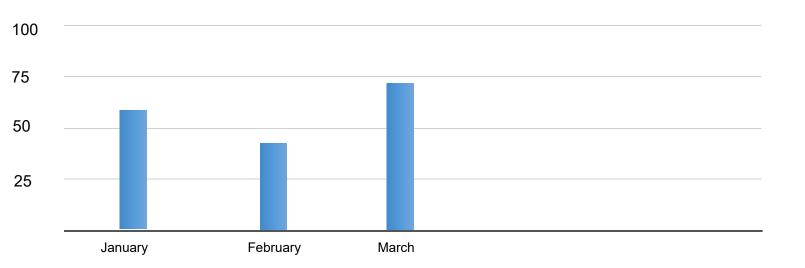

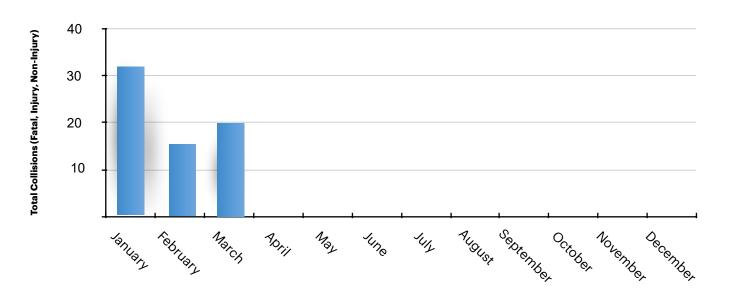
