#### PROCLAMATION OF NATIONAL CHIROPRACTIC HEALTH MONTH

**WHEREAS**, The opioid crisis continues to take a toll on the health and lives of millions of Americans, and has worsened in some communities during the COVID-19 pandemic;

**WHEREAS**, According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), as many as one in four patients who receive prescription opioids long term for non-cancer pain struggles with addiction, and from 1999-2020 more than 260,000 people died in the U.S. from overdoses involving prescription opioids;

**WHEREAS**, The interest in and need for greater access to safe and effective non-drug, noninvasive approaches to pain management has increased;

**WHEREAS**, The American College of Physicians (ACP) released updated low-back pain treatment guidelines in 2017 that promote the use of noninvasive, non-drug approaches such as spinal manipulation as a first line of defense against back pain, before the use of pain medications and surgery;

**WHEREAS**, The CDC in its draft 2022 prescribing guidelines also promotes diverse approaches and varied pain management solutions and specifically encourages use of non-drug therapies as a first line of treatment for subacute and chronic pain and even some types of acute pain;

**WHEREAS**, Doctors of chiropractic, who focus on the whole person with their non-drug, noninvasive treatments for pain management – most notably spinal manipulation – can play an important role in helping patients lessen their reliance on pain medications;

**WHEREAS**, There is a growing body of research supporting the early use of chiropractic spinal manipulation in helping patients with chronic low back pain to reduce or eliminate their need later for prescription opioid pain medications and surgery;

**WHEREAS**, With the theme "Chiropractic: On the Frontline for Pain," National Chiropractic Health Month 2022 serves as a reminder to citizens of that non-drug treatments for low-back pain such as spinal manipulation provided by doctors of chiropractic can help to lessen or eliminate the need for riskier, potentially addictive treatments and should be utilized where appropriate before starting prescription opioid pain medications.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City of Magnolia officially joins with the American Chiropractic Association (ACA) in proclaiming the month of October 2022 as National Chiropractic Health Month.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 0-2022-025**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS, AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2021–2022 ANNUAL BUDGET, ORDINANCE NO. O-2021-018, TO AMEND ADOPTED EXPENDITURES AND REVENUES OF THE BUDGET; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS**, the 2021-2022 Annual Budget was adopted by Ordinance O-2021-018 on September 14, 2021;

**WHEREAS**, various unforeseen circumstances affecting the City have presented themselves during the course of the fiscal year;

**WHEREAS**, the City Council considered the circumstances independently, deliberating appropriately on the associated revenues and expenditures and the overall impact on the general financial status of the City;

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the laws of the State of Texas, the City Council has determined that it will be beneficial and advantageous to the citizens of the City of Magnolia to amend the 2021–2022 budget as set forth herein; and

**WHEREAS**, this ordinance combines the independent Council actions into one budget amendment document;

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS, that:

**Section 1.** The findings set forth above are incorporated into the body of this ordinance.

<u>Section 2</u>. The annual budget for fiscal year 2021–2022 is hereby amended to transfer funds to bring the budgeted amounts in line with the projected amounts through the end of the fiscal year in the General Fund, Enterprise Fund, Hotel Motel Fund, and HB445 Fund, and is described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance as if set out verbatim herein.

<u>Section 3</u>. All ordinances of the City in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, and all other ordinances of the City not in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section 4</u>. Should any section, portion, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, it shall not invalidate or impair the force or effect of any other section or portion of this ordinance.

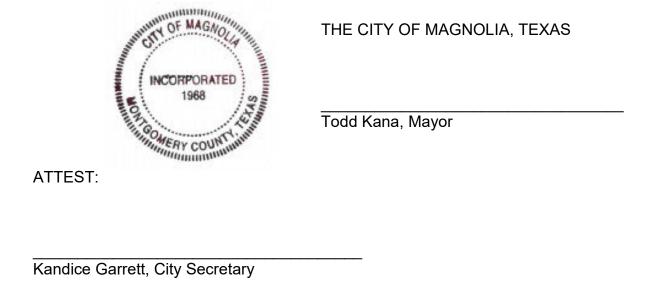

We received the final plat for the proposed Mill Creek Estates Section 7 development on August 8, 2022. On behalf of the City of Magnolia (the "City"), we have reviewed the submitted documents and are providing the following comments for your consideration:

- 1. Update the Montgomery County Engineer to Jeff Johnson for Sheet Two.
- 2. Update the notary signature blocks on Sheet Two for Montgomery County. They are currently shown as Harris County.
- 3. Provide radii at all cul-de-sacs and knuckles.
- 4. Label distances between the centerline and the right of way line where streets end of the plat boundary.
- 5. Update two recordation records for the abutting parcels on the west side of the plat near Cherry Creek Drive. Currently says, "Mill Creek Estates Section 6A Shts ---- MCMR".
- 6. Provide a table with the square footage calculations for each lot in the subdivision.
- 7. Provide open space calculation for each lot below 5,400 square feet as the development agreement provides.
- 8. Provide interior lot, side, and rear street setbacks as provided in the development agreement.
- 9. Provide parkland dedication or fee in lieu as outlined in the development agreement at the time of final plat recordation.
- 10. Provide a draft copy of covenants, conditions, and restrictions as outlined in the development agreement at the time of final plat recordation.
- 11. Provide evidence that Mill Creek Estates Section 7 Preliminary Plat was approved.
- 12. Provide copies of the tax certificates.
- 13. Provide signed and sealed metes and bounds.
- 14. Approve proposed street names from Montgomery County Emergency Communication District.
- 15. Provide TCEQ approval for Mill Creek Section 7 water, sanitary, drainage, and pavement (WSDP) plans.
- 16. Provide evidence that the drainage plan, improvement plans, and Montgomery County maintenance bond have been approved per requirements in the development agreement.



- 17. Provide a Comment Response Letter indicating the changes made in the following review.
- 18. Final plat shall be signed and sealed by a Professional Surveyor licensed in Texas.
- 19. Obtain all applicable utility company and governmental agency signatures.
- 20. Construction shall not commence until final agency approvals are secured.

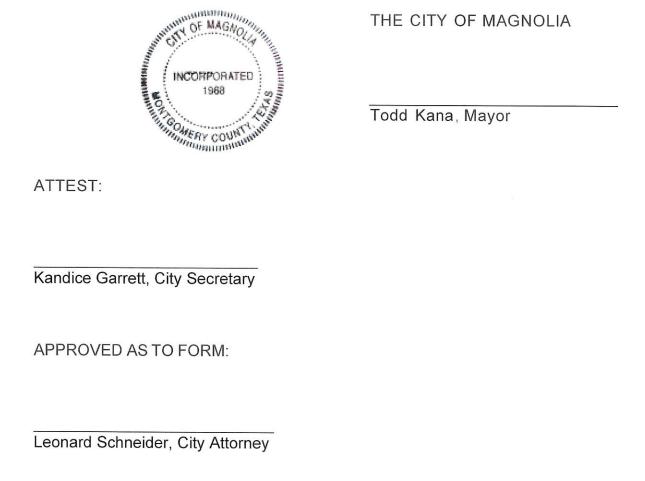

TO THE HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA:

Woodforest National Bank, a national banking organization, being the holder of title to all of, and therefore, a majority in value of the land hereinafter described, as such values are indicated by the tax rolls of the central appraisal district of Montgomery County, Texas (the "Landowner"), and Montgomery County Municipal Utility District No. 131 (the "District") (the Landowner and the District are hereinafter called, collectively, the "Petitioner"), acting pursuant to the provisions of Section 54.016, Texas Water Code, as amended, respectfully petition for consent to include additional land in a municipal utility district. In support of this petition, the Petitioner shows as follows:

I.

The District, to which the land hereinafter described is sought to be annexed, exists under the terms and provisions of Article XVI, Section 59 of the Constitution of Texas and Chapters 49 and 54, Texas Water Code, as amended, and was created by order of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality dated June 19, 2013. The Landowner is the sole owner and holder of fee simple title to the land sought to be annexed to the District, as indicated by the tax rolls of the central appraisal district of Montgomery County, Texas. The Landowner represents and warrants that there are no holders of liens against the land sought to be annexed.

II.

The land sought to be added to the District contains approximately 2.5769 acres of land, more or less, and lies wholly within Montgomery County, Texas. No part of said area is within the limits of any incorporated city or town. Woodforest National Bank, a national banking association, being the holder of title to all of, and therefore a majority in value of the land hereinafter described, as such values are indicated by the tax rolls of the central appraisal district of Montgomery County, Texas (the "Landowner"), and Audubon Management District (the "District") (the Landowner and the District are hereinafter called, collectively, the "Petitioner"), acting pursuant to the provisions of House Bill 4657, 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature, Regular Session, as codified under Chapter 3979 Texas Special District Local Laws Code (the "Act"), and the applicable provisions of Subchapter J, Chapter 49, Texas Water Code, as amended, respectfully petition for consent to include additional land in the District. In support of this petition, the Petitioner shows as follows:

I.

The District, to which the land hereinafter described is sought to be annexed, was created and operates pursuant to the provisions of the Act, Sections 52 and 52-a of Article III of the Texas Constitution, Section 59 of Article XVI of the Texas Constitution, Chapter 375 of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended, and the applicable provisions of Chapter 49 and 54 of the Texas Water Code, as amended. The Landowner is the holder of fee simple title to the land sought to be annexed to the District, as indicated by the tax rolls of the central appraisal district of Montgomery County, Texas. The Landowner represents and warrants that there are no holders of liens against the land sought to be annexed.

II.

The land sought to be added to the District contains approximately 2.5769 acres of land, more or less, and lies wholly within Montgomery County, Texas. No part of said area is within the limits of any incorporated city or town. Under the provisions of Texas Local Government Code, Section 42.001 et seq., as amended, all of said area, is (or will be by action of the City Council) within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Magnolia, Texas, and is not within such jurisdiction of any other city. All of the territory to be annexed may properly be annexed to the District.

The land sought to be added to the area of the District is described by metes and bounds in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes.

#### IV.

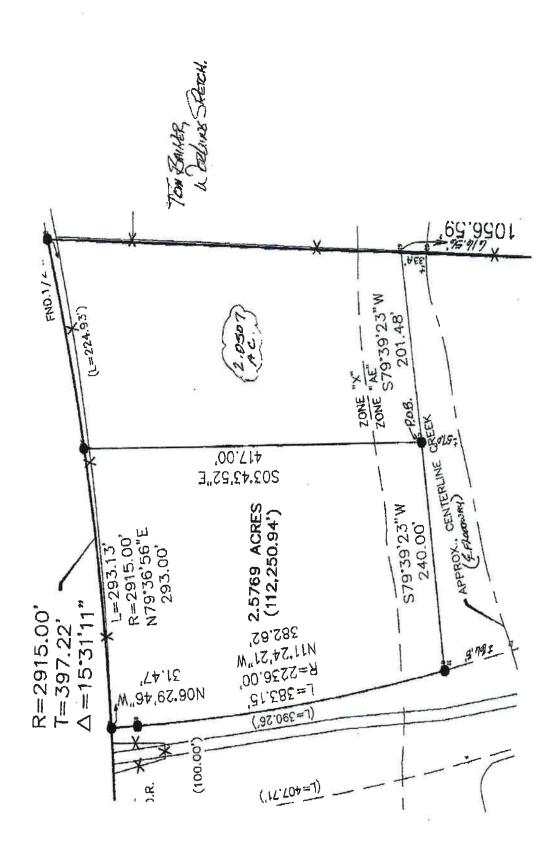

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 0-2022-027**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 2 "ADMINISTRATION" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND MAKING OTHER PROVISION RELATED THERETO

\* \* \* \* \* \*

**WHEREAS,** the City Council of the City of Magnolia, Texas has studied the present provisions of Chapter 2 "Administration" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Magnolia; and

**WHEREAS** the City Council is continually reviewing the provisions of the Code of Ordinances relating to circumstances which generally impact the health, safety and well-being of residents, citizens, and inhabitants; and

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Findings. The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as findings of fact and conclusions of law by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes.

<u>Section 2.</u> Amendments. Article II, "City Council," of Chapter 2 of the City of Magnolia Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as shown in attached Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein for all purposes.

<u>Section 3.</u> Repealing Clause. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed; provided, however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this ordinance shall be cumulative of other ordinances regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this ordinance.

<u>Section 4.</u> Severability. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance be severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences or sections of this ordinance, and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be enforced as written.

<u>Section 5.</u> Compliance Clause and Effective Date. The City Council finds, determines, and declares that a sufficient written notice was posted, and this Ordinance was passed in accordance with the Open Meetings Act. The City Secretary is instructed to publish this Ordinance in the Official Newspaper of the City of Magnolia in the manner

provided and for the time required by Section 52.011(a) of the Local Government Code, at which time this Ordinance takes effect.

#### ARTICLE II. CITY COUNCIL

Sec. 2-25 Rules of Procedure

(15) Rule 15: Citizen's right to be heard

- a. Any citizen shall have a reasonable opportunity to be heard at any and all regular meetings of the city council in regard to any and all matters on the agenda to be considered at any such meeting, or such other matters affecting city government as citizens may wish to bring to council's attention; provided, however, any matter not posted on the agenda may not be discussed by council, nor shall any action be taken by council, except to respond as allowed by the Texas Open Meetings Act. indicate that the matter may be placed on a later agenda. A time shall be set aside during each council meeting for the council to hear from the public on matters not on the agenda concerning any matter affecting city government. Citizens attending any regularly scheduled meeting may speak before council by completing a form and presenting it to the city secretary prior to the beginning of such meeting. In addition, citizens may request a councilmember to place an item on the agenda.
- b. For items on the agenda, the speaker will have three (3) minutes to complete his/her comments unless otherwise permitted by the presiding officer. The City Secretary shall maintain the time and advise the speaker when his/her time has expired at which time the speaker shall then complete his/her sentence and take his/her seat. For items not on the agenda during the public comment section, each speaker will have three (3) minutes to complete his/her comments unless otherwise permitted by the presiding officer. The City Secretary shall maintain the time and advise the speaker when his/her time has expired at which time the speaker shall then complete his sentence and take his/her seat

bc. No member of the public shall be heard until recognized by the presiding officer. Any member of the public interrupting city council proceedings or failing to abide by these rules of procedure in addressing city council, shall be deemed guilty of disorderly conduct and, at the direction of the presiding officer, shall be removed from council chambers by the sergeant-at-arms or other agent designated by city council. Any citizen shall be entitled to visit city hall, during regular business hours, and inspect all past council meeting minutes, city audits, and the agenda to be considered by the council in advance of the meeting and inform himself or herself

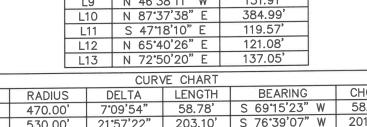

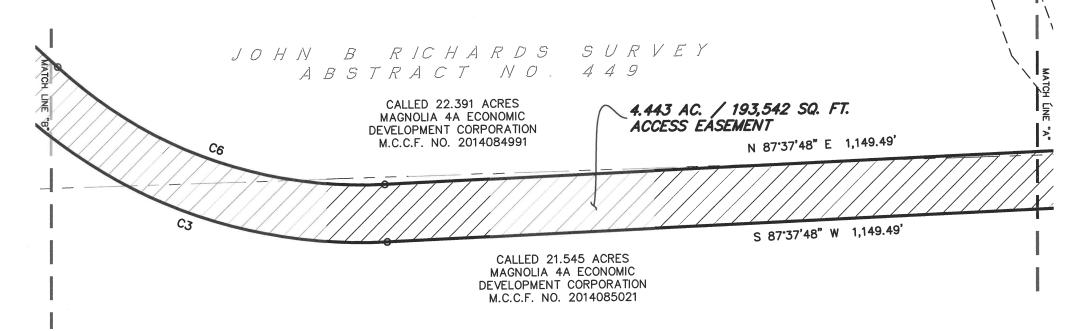

# WIFIA Program

- Created from the Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA) of 2014
- Accelerate national and regional water and wastewater infrastructure thru long-term, lowcost supplemental loans for credit assistance
- Administered by EPA, follow federal requirements
- Local, state, tribal, and federal government entities
- 2022 WIFIA lent approx. \$5.5B



# 2022 WIFIA Program Updates

- Federal Rules Still Apply
- Two Parameters Added in 2022 from Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)
  - Requirement for Build America, Buy America Act
     (BABAA) to create manufacturing jobs and grow the USA supply chain.
  - September 6 letter of intent accepted until funds are exhausted

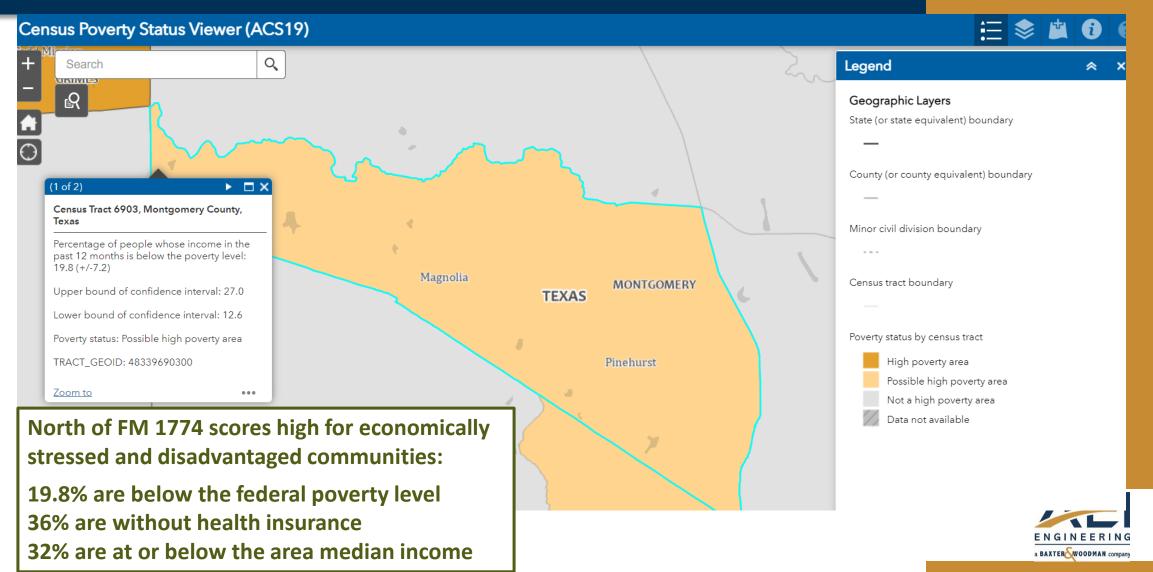

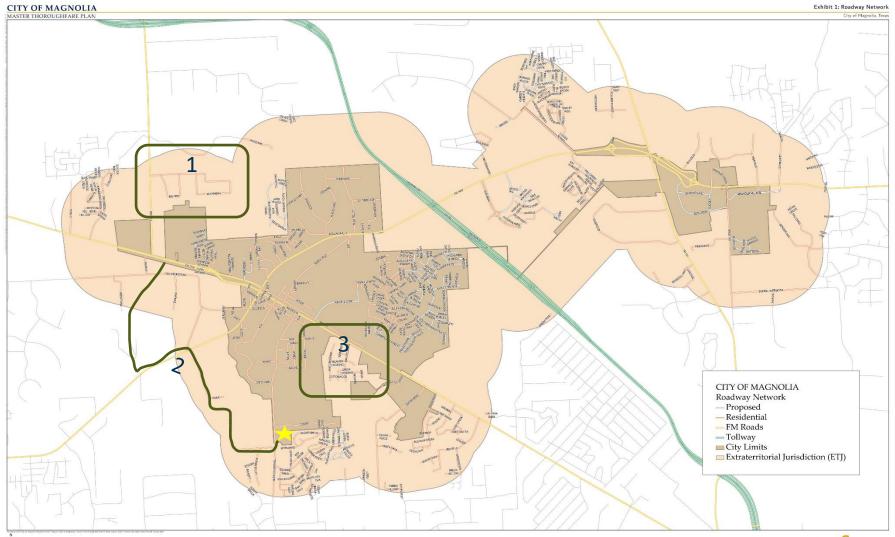

# **Potential Projects**

- Ordinance O-2013-020 to reduce # of private septic tanks in mobile home park subdivisions
- Ordinance O-2014-17 to remove junked vehicles, reduce fire hazard concerns, and protect the general health and safety of the public.
- City of Magnolia Intention: Address Sanitation Issues in Non-Development or Redevelopment Areas:
  - Provide sanitary sewer lines

# Potential Projects and Cost Estimate

- Project 1: Water and Sanitary to Serve "Brenda's" \$5.5M
  - Provide sanitary sewer,
  - Upgrade to an 8" waterline for fire hydrants and connect to FM 1488,
  - Removed junked vehicles, dilapidated homes, and overgrown vegetation (not in this project)
- Project 2: 30-inch Sanitary Gravity Line \$7.9M
  - Install 30" gravity sanitary sewer line is needed for capacity.
  - Connection to Nichols Sawmill Wastewater Treatment Plant
- Project 3: Water and Sanitary to Serve Magnolia Crossing \$3.3M
  - Provide sanitary sewer,
  - Upgrade 2" waterline for fire hydrants



# **Funding**

- For small communities with less than a 25,000 population
  - WIFIA can finance up to 49% of anticipated project costs AND 80% of anticipated project costs
  - Minimum \$5 Million project size
  - Requires \$25,000 payment with the application
- Repayment is 35 years from substantial completion
- Reimbursement program
- Interest rate is equal to or greater than the US Treasury, Average 1.93%

# Project Type Eligibility

## Construction of a wastewater treatment

#### Centralized Wastewater Treatment

Eligible centralized wastewater treatment projects include: primary and secondary treatment, advanced treatment, sewer system, CSO correction, climate resilience<sup>3</sup>, and security. Eligibilities related to energy and water conservation (e.g., cogeneration systems) are addressed in other sections of the paper (see *Energy Conservation* and *Water Conservation*).

# Project Type Eligibility

## Decentralized wastewater treatment

#### **Decentralized Wastewater Treatment**

Decentralized wastewater treatment is an onsite<sup>8</sup> or clustered system<sup>9</sup> used to collect, treat, and disperse or reclaim wastewater from a small community or service area (e.g., septic systems, cluster systems, lagoons). Eligible decentralized wastewater treatment projects include the upgrade (e.g., nutrient removal), repair, or replacement of existing systems; construction/installation of new systems; costs associated with the establishment of a responsible management entity (RME) (e.g., permitting fees, legal fees, etc.); and septage treatment works and pumper trucks to support the proper maintenance of decentralized systems.

## Section 603(c)(1) Eligibility: Section 212

POTWs, as defined in Section 212 of the CWA, are eligible for CWSRF assistance. The eligibility criteria for Section 603(c)(1) projects are:

- Projects must be consistent with the definition of "treatment works" as set forth in Section 212.
- Projects must be publicly owned, as required by CWA Section 603(c)(1).
- Only capital projects (e.g., construction activities, equipment purchase) are eligible. The CWSRF cannot fund ongoing operation and maintenance activities; however, planning and design for capital projects, as well as broader water quality planning where there is a reasonable expectation that the planning will result in a capital project, are eligible.



# Project Type Eligibility

## Water conversation, efficiency, and reuse,

#### **Water Conservation**

Eligible water conservation projects are those that reduce the demand for POTW capacity through reduced water consumption (i.e., water efficiency). Water reuse and precipitation harvesting are also eligible. Water audits and water conservation plans that are reasonably expected to result in a capital project are also eligible (see *Planning/Assessments*).

#### Water Efficiency

- Water meters
- · Plumbing fixture retrofits or replacement
- Water efficient appliances
- Water efficient irrigation equipment (e.g., moisture and rain sensing equipment)
- Education programs
- Incentive programs (e.g., rebates for installing rain barrels or permeable surfaces)

#### Water Reuse and Precipitation Harvesting

- Collection and treatment systems (e.g., wastewater, stormwater, and subsurface drainage water collection and treatment)
- Distribution lines to support water reuse and the use of harvested precipitation
- Transmission lines, injection wells, and green infrastructure infiltration systems for groundwater recharge
- · Equipment to reuse reclaimed water
- Direct potable reuse



# Define CWSRF Program Eligibilities

To be eligible for CWSRF assistance, a project must meet the criteria of one of the eleven CWSRF eligibilities. Section 603(c) of the Clean Water Act (CWA) states that the CWSRF can provide assistance:

- (1) to any municipality, intermunicipal, interstate, or State agency for construction of publicly owned treatment works (as defined in section 212);
- (2) for the implementation of a management program established under section 319;
- (3) for the development and implementation of a conservation and management plan under section 320:
- (4) for the construction, repair, or replacement of decentralized wastewater treatment systems that treat municipal wastewater or domestic sewage;
- (5) for measures to manage, reduce, treat, or recapture stormwater or subsurface drainage water<sup>1</sup>:
- (6) to any municipality, intermunicipal, interstate, or State agency for measures to reduce the demand for publicly owned treatment works capacity through water conservation, efficiency, or reuse;
- (7) for the development and implementation of watershed projects meeting the criteria set forth in section 122;
- (8) to any municipality, intermunicipal, interstate, or State agency for measures to reduce the energy consumption needs for publicly owned treatment works;
- (9) for reusing or recycling wastewater, stormwater, or subsurface drainage water;
- (10) for measures to increase the security of publicly owned treatment works
- (11) to any qualified nonprofit entity, as determined by the Administrator, to provide assistance to owners and operators of small and medium sized publicly owned treatment works
  - (A) to plan, develop, and obtain financing for eligible projects under this subsection, including planning, design, and associated preconstruction activities; and
  - (B) to assist such treatment works in achieving compliance with this Act.



# Define Drinking Water SRF Program Eligibilities

- <u>Drinking Water State Revolving Fund</u>
   (SRF) is also eligible for WIFIA
  - Must be a public system (provides water for human consumption thru pipes to at least 15 service connections and serves at least 25 people for 60-80 days a year
  - Projected intended primarily to address public health and/or regulatory compliance issues for the existing service population may be sized for a reasonable amount of population growth over the useful life of the project

- Non-Eligible Projects

## 3.4.1 <u>Growth-Related Projects</u>

The DWSRF is meant to serve the public health needs of the existing population. Congress specifically directed in the SDWA that the DWSRF program avoid the use of funds to finance the expansion of any public water system in anticipation of future population growth. <sup>9</sup> The EPA specified in the DWSRF Interim Final Rule that a project which is intended primarily to address public health and/or regulatory compliance issues for the existing service population may be sized for a "reasonable" amount of population growth over the useful life of the project.



## **TABLE 3.1: Category 1 - Treatment**

- New facilities or portions of facilities, including:
  - Mixers/Flocculation/Sedimentation
  - Filtration
  - Chemical addition systems and equipment
  - Disinfection
  - Filter backwash recycling
  - o Residuals handling

Dear Director of the WIFIA Program,

I write this letter of support for the project we submit for the 2022 Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (WIFIA) Program for water and wastewater funding and financing. As a smaller community with a population estimate of 2,359 reported for the 2020 Census, we are pleased to see funding and grant opportunities available, as a city of our size would unlikely be able to fund a project of this capacity on our own.

Since 2013, City Council has prioritized eliminating private septic tank systems throughout our city limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction through development and redevelopment opportunities. When sanitary systems are identified, waterlines are updated to minimize disruption to our residents when there are numerous breaks within a subdivision per year. With an estimate of 50 private septic tanks identified in subdivisions that are not part of future development, there is a need to provide a better quality of life for our residents with a focus on sanitation issues. For the past two years, waterlines in both subdivisions have been breaking more than they are working and are at the end of their useful life. We propose reducing fire hazards, extending sanitary sewers, updating water service, and installing fire hydrants in the subdivisions.

Two subdivisions are identified for this effort. One subdivision is identified in Texas Census Tract 6903 as economically stressed and disadvantaged at 19.8% below the federal property level, 32% at or below the area median income, and 36% without insurance. This subdivision has private septic tanks, dilapidated homes, overgrown vegetation, and junked cars with undersized waterlines that continuously break throughout the year and need repair. The second subdivision requires sanitary sewer lines and water lines for the same reasons. Our 2019 Wastewater Master Plan identified that a 30-inch gravity sanitary sewer line is needed to bring these subdivisions online due to capacity issues of our wastewater system city-wide.

We anticipate that removing septic tanks will reduce the impacts of potential emerging contaminants in our wastewater systems with innovative approaches that impact climate change and resiliency for the future.

- 4. Reimburse D.L. Glover Inc. for re-stocking nine (9) 16-inch gate valves. The proposed change is a lump sum amount and increases the contract total amount by \$10,745.23.
- 5. Extend the contract completion date by an additional seventy (70) calendar days.

The five (5) items listed above result in a net total contract increase of \$199,445,23.

#### Justification:

1-3. The proposed tie-ins identified to be performed via wet connections will result in taking the existing water main out of service. The existing water main cannot be taken out of service due to water pressure issues within the City. Six (6) TS&V's and six (6) line stops will be installed on the existing water main in order to perform the tie-ins without taking the water main out of service.



- 4. Nine (9) 16-inch gate valves were deleted from the project as a result of Change Order No. 1. Due to the unforeseen circumstances of the re-stockig fee incurred, AEI recommends reimbursement for re-stocking these gate valves.
- 5. An additional seventy (70) calendar days are added to complete the work above and for CenterPoint delays associated with the 16-inch force main crossing at FM 249.

OWNER further agrees that the ENGINEER's review and action in relation to these submissions shall not constitute the provision of means, methods, techniques, sequencing, or procedures of construction or extend to safety programs of precautions. ENGINEER's consideration of a component does not constitute acceptance of the assembled item.
- c. Review construction record drawings for completeness prior to submission to CADD.
- d. Prepare construction contract change orders and work directives when authorized by the OWNER.
- e. Review the Contractor's requests for payments as construction work progresses and advise the OWNER of amounts due and payable to the Contractor in accordance with the terms of the construction contract documents.
- f. Research and prepare written response by ENGINEER to request for information from the OWNER and Contractor.
- g. Construction Manager or other office staff visit site as needed.

#### 4. Field Observation - Part Time

a. ENGINEER will provide a Field Project Representative (FPR) at the construction site on a periodic part-time basis from the ENGINEER's office of not more than eight (8) hour per regular weekday, not including legal holidays as deemed necessary by the ENGINEER, to assist the Contractor with interpretation of the Drawings and Specifications, to observe in general if the Contractor's work is in conformity with the Final Design Documents and to monitor the Contractor's progress as related to the Construction Contract date of completion.

Good Afternoon Don,

Thank you for your time today to discuss the City of Magnolia's waste services and revisit a few items discussed in our last meeting.

#### **BULK/HEAVY WASTE**

Before our meeting in December, residents would call the city to schedule bulk and heavy waste which would require a manual email to our OPS team and routing for a specific Saturday. GFL met with the city and came up with a new plan. Since the change in January 2022, the solid waste bulk/heavy service changed from on call to 1X per week. The city now receives (3) additional pickups per month at no additional charge. GFL has received positive feedback regarding the change, resulting in a significantly lower number of calls to the city.

#### **YARD WASTE**

We also touched on the Yard Waste Guidelines. In the past, a grapple truck would be scheduled for yard waste which generated excessive time to retrieve. By changing the process and picking up yard waste weekly, this has reduced the need for the grapple truck and the drivers can quickly move throughout the city. We do ask, for the safety of our drivers, to please either bundle or neatly stack tree limbs and boards and cut them in 4 ft length. We have supervisors that continually monitor the city, so if there is a one- off that needs guidance, please let us know.

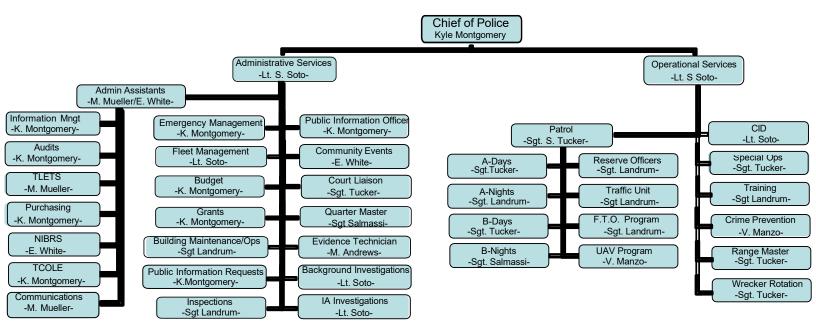

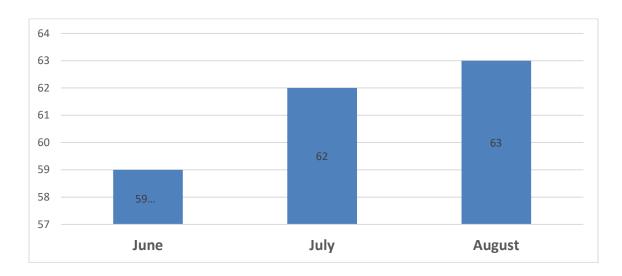

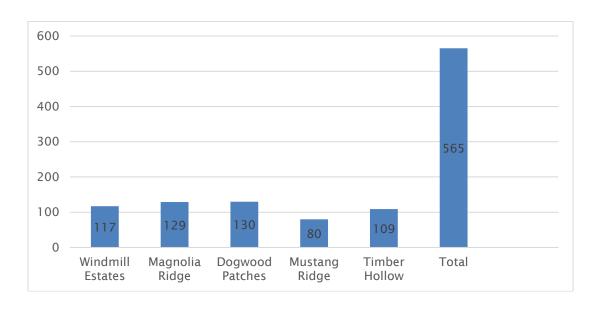

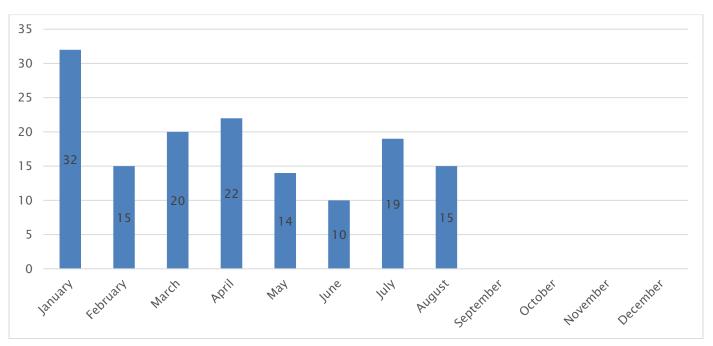
