Chessie Zimmerman, with Stratus Properties Inc., provided handouts of the latest site plan and pointed out an upcoming single-family development of a 27-acre tract located on the south side of the project bringing possibly 80-90 homes. Multi-family development is expected on two separate tracts west of the HEB. Getting the fuel station in is moving a bit slower due to the rain, but she estimates the infrastructure is about 45 days out for HEB and noted that construction has begun on the retail upfront.

City Administrator Don Doering reported Phase 2 of the sewer line extension after over a year of delay is almost complete in three weeks of construction with new contractor. The wastewater treatment plant is also nearly complete and should be done by May. He also noted that with the fiscal year 42% over we have collected 79% budgeted revenue and spent 34% of our budgeted expenses.
