MINUTES OF PUBLIC MEETING OF THE MAGNOLIA CITY COUNCIL FEBRUARY 13, 2024

A meeting of the City Council was held on this date, February 13, 2024, beginning at 6:03 pm in the Sewall Smith Council Chambers 18111 Buddy Riley Blvd., Magnolia, Texas 77354.

1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Mayor Pro Tem Carby called the meeting to order at 6:03 pm.

- a. INVOCATION
 - Councilmember Dantzer delivered the invocation.
- b. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Pro Tem Carby led the Pledge of Allegiance to the USA and Texas flags.

c. ROLL CALL AND CERTIFICATION OF A QUORUM

Mayor Pro Tem Carby called the roll, certifying a quorum was present with the following Council members in attendance: Daniel Miller, Matthew Dantzer, Richard Carby, Brenda Hoppe, and Jack L Huitt Jr.

Absent: Mayor Todd Kana

2. CITIZEN COMMENTS, REQUESTS OR PETITIONS FROM THE PUBLIC

(This agenda item provides an opportunity for citizens to address the City Council on any matter not on the agenda). Comments shall be limited to three (3) minutes per person. Comments by the governing body shall be limited to:

- a. Statements of specific factual information given in response to an inquiry;
- b. A recitation of existing policy in response to an inquiry;
- c. A proposal to place the subject on a future agenda.

Andrew Vigneaux voiced concern regarding building and expanding the City and how it can negatively affect current residents.

Audrey Amirian stated that her neighbors within Mill Creek are concerned about water safety after the last disruption and asked that the City notify the public why one neighborhood was issued a boil water notice while others are not. She clarified the inconvenience of losing water due to Audubon opening valves and asked that it is timed better in the future. She stated that the City's after-hours system does not recognize Mill Creek residents as utility customers making it difficult to seek assistance.
