

ORDINANCE 189

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE MAXIMUM PRIMA FACIE SPEED LIMITS ESTABLISHED FOR VEHICLES UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE 6701d, VERNON'S ANNOTATED CIVIL STATUTES, WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA AS SET OUT IN THIS ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING A PENALTY OF A FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$200.00 FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Whereas, Article 6701d, Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes, provides that whenever the governing body of the City shall determine upon the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation that any prima facie speed therein set forth is greater or less than is reasonable or safe under the conditions found to exist at any intersection or other place or upon any part of a street or the highway within the City, taking into consideration the width and condition of the pavement and other circumstances on such portion of said street or highway, as well as the usual traffic thereon, said governing body may determine and declare a reasonable and safe prima facie speed limit thereat or thereon by the passage of an ordinance, which shall be effective when appropriate signs giving notice thereof are erected at such intersection or other place or part of the street or highway; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAGNOLIA, TEXAS:

Section 1. Upon the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation heretofore made as authorized by the provisions of Article 6701d, Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes, the following prima facie speed limit is established for the City of Magnolia, Texas within its corporate limits:

the maximum legal speed limit shall be Thirty (30) miles per hour, except where otherwise set, which is to be marked by appropriate signage indicating the speed limit.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined a sum not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).


Section 3. The City Secretary shall notice this ordinance in the customary manner in the official newspaper of the City of Magnolia, Texas.


